member or friend again? Are they in a better place? These questions are tinged with a hope that they will be seen again and that they are in a better place.

It's strange how these two things are at odds with each other.

We seem utterly unable as a society to face the God question and yet at the end of life, (a time which has been so front and centre as the global pandemic rages on), we do

want more. We want to find more. We believe in more.

Can I encourage us all to embrace the tension of these things? To not be fearful, to discuss, to ask questions and challenge: because if there is more than this, then that is the biggest thing we can ever discover!

Job club on a mission to help people re-skill

The Highworth Christians Against Poverty (CAP) Job Club based at The Bridge Centre is celebrating one year of delivering free Job Clubs for people across the area. They are starting their 5th course on Tuesday 2nd November and so far over half of the previous course members have found work!

Due to the pandemic, it is anticipated that many people, both those in and out of work, will be re-assessing their priorities and making dramatic life changes including changing careers.

Kathryn Ford, Job Club Manager, said: "After what we've all been through over the past year we're looking at what is important to us and for some it may be that they want a better work life balance. This may mean a change of careers.

"Job seekers will need to look at ways to make their applications stand out in the job market. This could mean that they need to improve their existing skills or learn new ones.

"Our job club has proved to be a real confidence booster and has helped job seekers emphasise their volunteering skills and make the move into new and fulfilling work."

Job Club member, Callie*, lacked confidence when she started the Job Club having been out of work for some time. She said: "I was nervous when I first went to the Job Club but I did it! It



was comfortable, welcoming and friendly. It's a relaxed atmosphere."

The CAP Job Club helped Callie* find work.

"I started getting the hang of using a computer, then I started volunteering. I applied for a role as assistant manager. I've got it! I love the job!"

The seven-week course provides jobseekers with essential skills, such as

CV writing, interview technique (including socially distanced and online interviews) and the value of volunteering. At the heart of the course is a supportive peer-to-peer group where course members can share their experiences, struggles and advice. In addition, each is given one-to-one coaching to develop their strengths and identify other opportunities such as volunteering or additional training.

The course will be led by trained CAP Job Club coaches at The Bridge Centre, 8 Sheep Street, Highworth, SN6 7AA.

Each weekly session starts at 1pm with group time for about 90 minutes for up to 10 people, with lunch and drinks provided.

Ask AMS Tax on electric cars

Since April 2020, electric cars have become even more tax efficient.

e.g. buying an Electric Car (as Company car)

If you take £30,000 profit from a company to buy an electric car: Car cost = £30,000. Tax = nil (and annual benefit-in-kind = 1% in 2021/22 so perhaps £161).

Buying Petrol/Diesel Car (as Personal car)

Use £30,000 profit to buy a personally-owned fuel car. Leave Corporation Tax in the company (at 19% = £5,700) and take a £24,300 dividend. Then you must set aside money for higher rate income tax on the dividend (marginal rate: income tax/ dividend tax 32.5% = £7,897), leaving £16,403 available for a petrol/diesel car. Cash for Car = only £16,403. Cash to HMRC = £13,597

And as Corporation Tax rates and dividend tax rates increase, the differential will get bigger.

British artist L. S. Lowry, one of Britain's most iconic artists, lived with his overbearing mother, Elizabeth, until her death in 1939. Bed-ridden and bitter, Elizabeth actively tries to dissuade her bachelor son from pursuing his artistic



ambitions, while never failing to voice her disappointment in him. Spall plays Lowry and Redgrave his overbearing mother.

Peter Bradshaw in the Guardian wrote that Vanessa Redgrave gives a shrewd and amusingly bleak performance here as Elizabeth Lowry, the cantankerous and bedridden mother of the artist LS Lowry played by Timothy Spall. Through it all is Elizabeth's deadpan gloom: Lowry patiently asks her to be cheerful and she replies acidly: "I haven't been cheerful since 1898."

Jobs to do in November from 'Allotment Month by Month' by Alan Buckingham



Harvest - Root veg, autumn brassica and late salad

Pick - Autumn Raspberries and Cranberries. Sow Broad Beans outdoors. Plant Garlic and Rhubarb

Plant - New bare-root fruit trees and bushes before the ground becomes too cold and wet

Prune - Apples and Pear trees. Also, soft fruit trees

Dig - Over your plot, removing any perennial weeds and adding plenty of well-rotted organic material

Cover - Beds with polythene, carpet or cardboard to protect the soil from heavy rain. (More ecofriendly alternatives are available)

Remove - Nets from fruit cages, but keep brussels sprouts cabbages and other brassicas

Keeping our roads safe: Community Speedwatch update

In September, the Highworth CSW team of 29 active members volunteered their time to do 72 sessions (80 in August, 71 in July) totalling 77.49hrs (86.46 in August, 76.29 in July).

They reported 1688 vehicles for speeding on Cricklade Road, Eastrop, Redlands, Roundhills Mead, Shrivenham Road and St Michael's Avenue. (1869 in August, 1299 in July). Of that total, 99 vehicles exceeded speed limits by 150%+(115 in August, 92 in July).

As a percentage of vehicle count in September, 4.53% were reported for speeding, (5.72% in August, 4.53% in July).

As a percentage of those reported, in September, 5.86% were excessive speeders (6.15% in August, 7.08% in July). The team believes this proves they are influencing those drivers choosing to speed excessively, which is very encouraging.

The team also believes the vast majority of local drivers are sticking to the speed limits and would like to say thank you to everyone who sticks to the speed limits in Highworth, making it safer for all.

The team needs more volunteers to help run sessions and make the town's roads safer for road users and pedestrians. The minimum commitment is one hour a month. If you are interested, please email highworthcsw@gmail.com.

Team members must be over the age of 18, able to stand for the duration of a session and be able to read the licence plate of a passing vehicle. CSW is a scheme run by Wiltshire Police. All volunteers are trained by Traffic Management Policing Officers and comply with a code of practice.







For those not able to come along in person we will be continuing Zoom access to the Café and will send out the Zoom details well ahead of the events.



Fire! Fire!

We are used to seeing a fire engine speeding to a fire. But how, in the past, did Highworth cope?

The town has always had a problem with water supplies. It's at the top of a hill, with water reached from wells or pumps. There is no river or stream nearby. The town did not have a piped water supply until 1904 and even then it was unreliable. Leather buckets and a small fire engine were held in the church.

In 1858 it was decided that a new horse-drawn engine would be built and the old one repaired. The men who manned it were volunteers but were paid for attending practices and for turning out to a fire. Civilians who turned out to help the brigade were also paid a small sum. The problem at the start seemed to be the horses.

The Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette on September 11th, 1858 reported the following:

"Between 8 and 9 in the evening of Wednesday last a fire broke out at Botany Farm, Castle Eaton. Destroyed were 2 hay ricks, about 6 tons, 2 straw ricks, a barn containing unthreshed wheat and an outhouse. The fire raged all night and also destroyed a cottage near the farm. A large crowd came to help under the guidance of Inspector Passmore of Cricklade and Sgt. Saunders of Highworth.

The Highworth engine did not arrive until 1am, drawn by the men all the way from Highworth. No horses could be procured in the town."

This led to letters in the press:

9th October 1858

"Highworth Fire Engine"

"Notice is hearby given. To all Persons residing at a distance requiring the Highworth Fire Engine. They are requested to send Two Horses Ready Harnessed with common Thill Harness, so that the engines may be started without delay.

By order of the Inspectorate. John C Salmon, Clerk."

Later the horse situation was resolved but problems still arose.

Swindon Advertiser 7th May 1892

"Fire in Stanton Fitzwarren"

"The fire was reported at 3am and the Fire Brigade from Highworth was quickly summoned but there was some difficulty in getting the horses to go, one of them showing a strong objection to being turned out of the stable at that early hour."

Eventually the engine got to the fire, but the cottage, and the one next to it, had been destroyed.

Many of the smaller houses in Highworth still had thatched roofs which easily caught fire from sparks.

Swindon Advertiser 21st April 1883

"At 1pm on Wednesday 8 cottages in the vicinity of Swindon Street, located in an area known as Puzzle Alley took fire and in the space of a few hours all burnt to the ground. Most of them were termed as uninhabitable with thatched roofs. There was a danger of the fire spreading to Mr Rixon's barn and other cottages. The only water available was from a well. At 2pm a telegram was sent to

Swindon for help. At 2.45 the Swindon Voluntary Fire Brigade drove into town. They had covered the 6 miles in less than half an hour."

In 1895 when a thatched building in Eastrop caught fire the newspaper stated that: "thatched roofs are rapidly disappearing, and this fire has removed a not very elegant example which cannot be looked upon with regret."

Many fires started in stores holding inflammable substances. A tallow chandler (candle maker) in the High Street had left his pan of tallow over a low heat overnight so that he could start making candles the next day. The pan caught fire in the early hours with the town awoken by the church and chapel bells and the town crier. Luckily the

fire was contained to the one property (now 'Two's Company').

In May 1911 there was a fire in Mr Moulton's paint shop (now Highworth Hardware). The alarm was given at 11pm, by which time the fire had taken a strong hold. The Fire Brigade was soon there and there was a good supply of water. The fire was out by 12.30 and did not spread to Mr Moulton's house.

Fire that destroyed the Sun Brewery in Brewery Street, 1974

The next week's paper announced that Mr Moulton had been charged with setting his own property on fire. However, the police said the case had carefully been gone into and the charges were dismissed.

Highworth's last major fire will be remembered by some people in the town. In November 1974, a fire wrecked the Meredew furniture factory in Brewery Street (now the site of the Co-op). Flames 50 feet high could be seen from Swindon and police closed all the roads into the town. Fire crews from Swindon. Cricklade, Wootton Bassett, Malmesbury, Cirencester, Ramsbury and Faringdon attended.

Haresfield Knives: A cut above the rest



Ever thought about what goes in to making a kitchen knife? Neither had Ben Peters. Until 2018 he made do, like many of us, with a set of five Asda kitchen knives. Now he runs Haresfield Knives and makes beautiful, bespoke kitchen knives from his converted garage in Haresfield.

First things first! How did you get in to knife making?

"I was asked to join a small knifemaking company at the end of 2018 and this is where I learned a lot about knives. I left this company in 2021 and decided that I enjoyed making knives so much I would start it up as a hobby and here I am!"

What is your favourite thing about what you do?

"The feedback that I get. When someone uses a knife that you have spent many hours hand crafting, I think they can feel the effort and the love put into it. This translates into great feedback from everyone who has tried one, the satisfaction is very rewarding for me."

Where do you do all your work?

"I have converted my garage into a 'clean' area for heat treatment, routing, engraving, sharpening and cleaning. I have built a shed in the garden for the 'dirty' work of grinding, sanding, polishing, cutting and turning. It's small, but I'm only just getting started!"

How often are you making?

"I started prototyping and building my workshop 7 days a week as I was furloughed due to Covid, I took a few days off for video games and beer though!

"I now work full time for the NHS so my evenings and weekends are spent at the grinder, polisher, router and sharpener."

Where do you get your ideas from?

"I have no idea. Things just pop up. I chat to someone about knitting... so I'll make a handle with yarn in. I see a product that reminds me of a vegetable, I'll make a chopper out of it!"

Who do you make knives for?

"My knives are perfect for anyone who uses a kitchen knife that wants a handmade, personal product. They also work fantastically as a gift as they are all completely custom made and not something you can pick up off the shelf. They will last a lifetime too. I want people to enjoy using a kitchen knife instead of it being a chore."

Where do you go from here?

"My aim is to keep providing custom, tailored

knives to anyone who enjoys using or even collecting them. I want to create things that people are proud to own and in turn provide for my own family."



Re-wilding St Michael's Churchyard



You may have noticed a scruffy fenced off area crop up in a part of St Michael's Churchyard this year. What do you think of it, I wonder? I know some people have thought it a disgrace and too messy. Others have noticed more butterflies and wondered whether or not the slow worms have moved in. I hope you have taken time to wonder why it has been done and what we are hoping to achieve with it.

We are trying to follow the directions from an organisation appropriately called 'Caring for God's Acre'. The people who set up the initiative realised that, in our ever more urban world, the ancient churches in our cities, towns and villages surrounded by graveyards could be put to use for the benefit of wildlife. In Devon, there are many churches who have taken on the task of rewilding their whole Churchyard.

The powerfully-named 'Living Churchyards' project is not so much a vision of the dead rising up as the dead providing sanctuary for species whose living space had been cut back.

Our hope in allowing this relatively small area of our graveyard to grow scruffy is that we will eventually encourage the dormant seeds below the grass to germinate, enhancing the biodiversity of our town and providing food, shelter and opportunity for bats, mice, frogs, toads, slow worms, birds and insects.

We hope in time to be able to invite community groups and schools to come and do surveys of the wildlife and to maybe build bug hotels or bat boxes. This is an exciting, long-term project that will be for the benefit of the whole town and we hope you are willing to get behind and support us in this endeavour.

With the help of the friends of Pentylands country park we have started the arduous task of scything back the now long grass that grew this year which will have used the nutrients in the soil, preparing the ground for new growth next year. If you would like more information on what we are doing and why we are doing it, a good place to start is the 'Caring for God's Acre' website.



From our MP

A few weeks ago I enjoyed another very informative visit to The Bridge to see the wonderful work it does to support the local community.

The Bridge, run by Highworth Community
Churches, provides a number of services, such as:
a support group for those with long term
illnesses, computer and printing facilities, debt
crisis support and money management advice;
the latter led by the brilliant Kathryn Ford and
Christians Against Poverty (CAP). This practical
support and advice offered by CAP and The
Bridge helps families in real times of need. I met
with a number of families who have benefitted,
whether through direct practical interventions, or
regular ongoing support. I am full of admiration
for Kathryn and the team of volunteers.

Having spent many years as a DWP Minister (I have just switched to become the Deputy Chairman of the Conservative Party), I understand the importance of providing support in times of need.

On Welfare Support, Universal Credit is helping simplify the very complex legacy benefit system. Claimants now have one point of contact, where personalised and tailored support can be provided; a stark contrast to legacy benefits where a claimant would have to navigate the Local Authority, Housing Association, HMRC and the DWP. No wonder £2.3bn was unclaimed each year as claimants, often the most vulnerable, were simply overwhelmed. There is still much more to do, but I very much welcome the continued improvements to increase the taper rates (allowing claimants to keep more money as they move into work), increases to the Local Housing Allowance, the significant increase in free childcare (vital for working families), the

new Life Time Skills Guarantee (helping people of all ages to retrain) and the doubling of work coaches across our Job Centres to increase the one to one professional support.

I have also been a strong advocate for making sure we have additional, flexible support, so I welcome the recent announcement of an additional £500m of local Welfare Support, targeting those most in need and bringing together not just national support, but local coordinated support.

Finally, I very much welcome the extension of both the free school meals provision into the school holidays and the introduction of the Holiday Activities Scheme, something I have championed in Parliament for many years. I have seen first-hand what a difference this is making to families and crucially the children in Swindon.

Kathryn and her team are not just providing that extra layer of local support, but I value their feedback, advice and suggestion to help shape future changes. To have them in the heart of our local community really is making a difference.




