Limited Company Director – what are the advantages?

For example, Directors must act in the best interests of their Company, and not allow it to trade if they believe it will be unable to pay its debts. Update on the Old Golf Course

Whatever one's personal views on the Old Golf Course, the 20th January was undoubtedly a significant date.

Following a sustained and incredibly well-supported campaign and with the full backing of Highworth Town Council, the (almost unanimous) backing of Swindon Borough Councillors of all political persuasions and of our MP Justin Tomlinson, Swindon Borough Council voted overwhelmingly to remove Highworth's Old Golf Course from the Local Plan. Councillor Steve Weisinger's amendment was passed to no small amount of applause from the large number of Highworth residents who attended the event in person.

This result surprised many who said that it could never be achieved and means that, in the lifetime of the latest Local Plan, no houses will be built on Highworth's Old Golf Course.

Reassurances from our MP and Highworth's three Borough Council representatives, delivered through all of our letterboxes the day afterwards, was a firm and public promise to that effect with which the Action Group is delighted.

However, this was only the first step in securing the long-term future of the Old Golf Course. In voting away the opportunity to sell the land for housing development, SBC have removed a much-needed source of income and will, naturally, now seek other ways to raise revenue from the Old Golf Course land; it will not pay for its own upkeep. The Action Group recognise this need and are now working hard to set up a collaborative working group with both HTC and SBC to help with the formation and delivery of coherent plans to sustainably maintain the Old Golf Course as accessible, open green space that remains unbuilt upon.

This will be a difficult task and will require the input and efforts of Highworth's residents. Having strongly voiced our views about how much the Old Golf Course means to us (surprising many with the success we have collectively achieved) we now all need to work together to ensure that our success to date is not lost. The support needed from us all will take many forms: expertise and knowledge, volunteering, fundraising, donating, leaflet dropping, etc.

The Action Group now looks to all of those 4,655 individuals who have supported the cause so magnificently to date, and achieved the great success of 20th January, to rally together to make our vision of a sustainable, manageable and maintainable open, green space a reality for current and future generations of Highworth and Swindon Borough residents.

Sow Outdoors – Broad Beans, Cabbages, Calabrese, Leeks, Lettuces, Onions, Parsnips, Peas, Spinach, Spring Onions, Sprouting Broccoli, Asparagus, Cauliflower, Chinese Artichokes, Garlic, Jerusalem Artichokes, Potatoes and Rhubarb sets.

Sow Fruit – Apple and Pear trees, Gooseberries and Currants, Grape Vines Raspberries, Strawberries, Cranberries and Blackberries.

Sow Indoors – Aubergines, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbages, Celeriac, Celery, Chillis and Peppers, Cucumbers, Florence Fennel, Globe Artichokes, Kohl Rabi, Lettuces, Sprouting Broccoli and Tomatoes.

Thames Water pipeline progresses



It has been fascinating watching the large water pipe being laid through Pentylands Country Park. First a fortymetre-wide strip was fenced off from the lane towards Hannington and curving around the wetland area.

Then the diggers arrived scraping back the topsoil into neat piles. The next thing was to 'build' a temporary road with lorry loads of stone to stop vehicles getting bogged down in the clay.

Next came the one metre diameter pipes. These got welded together into long sections lying on rollers. These then went into three metre trenches lined with stones.

Where the pipeline came into and exited the park there is a ten-inch diameter pipe bringing

water to us in Highworth. The new pipe had to be very carefully pulled under this pipe. A Thames Water Man told me that they had diverted the water while this was being done "just in case"!

The next CAP Job Club course starts on 15th March



Highworth Based

From Highworth to Toowoomba, Australia

In the 1870s the Swindon Advertiser was showing adverts for emigration to Queensland. Free passage was offered to agricultural workers along with other trades. A single man could earn £35 a year plus food. One of the people who took up this offer was the 14-year-old Thomas Ackling from Highworth.

He was the son of another Thomas who received a letter from him in 1876, two years after his son had emigrated. This letter was published in the Swindon paper.

'At present, unusual facilities are being offered to emigrate to Queensland and that all persons wanting to emigrate should make immediate application to do so at the office of this paper'.

The Letter:

Dear Father.

I have taken the trouble to write a few lines to you hoping to find you quite well as it leaves me at present. We had a pleasant voyage but so long; we were 4 months on the water. We stayed in Brisbane about 3 or 4 days and then went up country about 100 miles where I got a place, and a very good place, to look after 2 horses and do any work, and I get 10/- a week and tucker and lodgings.

I have to do my own washing but my master will let me have an hour or two to do it in, so that is no trouble to me. I like my place very well and I like the country too very well but I think I can do better up the bush. My master is about taking a large farm up the bush, I have been and looked at it and I like it very much, and so do he like me.

I have a horse to ride when I like and I take a ride around the country. Tell any man that if he can milk he can do well out here, I am not afraid but what I can get a good living and save plenty of money. I liked the water very much and was always at the top of the mast.

Anyone that will work can do well out here, but without work you cannot get a living out here. One week's work will keep you a fortnight at the least. Clothes are cheaper than in England because they want no linings. I bought 2 hats for 1/-, a pair of trousers for 5/- and a pair of strong boots for 8/-

Thomas Ackling at Mr. John Little's, Bell Street, Toowoomba.

Several members of the Ackling families emigrated to Australia. A Henry Ackling married a Winifred Batt, also from Highworth. After their marriage they lived at Jane Street, Randwick, Sydney, naming their house, 'Highworth Cottage'. Thomas also ended up in Sydney.

There is a town called Highworth in Queensland, named by settlers who arrived there.





A quick and easy recipe for a family feast for 4

For a twist, instead of cannelloni beans use a can of mixed beans, red kidney beans in a chilli sauce (don't drain the sauce away) or even butter beans – mix it up to suit your taste!



Ingredients

- 1 pack of Helen Browning's Speedy Sausages
- 1 tbs olive oil
- 2 crushed garlic cloves
- 1 celery stick diced
- 2 carrots diced
- 1 tin of cannelloni beans, drained & rinsed
- 2 x 400g chopped tomatoes
- 1 tsp smoked paprika
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 tsp dried oregano
- 300ml chicken stock made with
- 1/2 stock cube

Method

Step 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C/gas mark 6

Step 2. Heat the oil in a large casserole pot. Gently brown the sausages for 5 minutes. Remove from the pan, then add the diced onion, celery and carrot and cook for 10 minutes until softened and golden. Add the garlic, chopped tomatoes, beans, paprika, oregano, bay leaves and chicken stock. Simmer for 30 minutes, then add back in the speedy sausages for 15 minutes until thickened.

Serve with a jacket potato and grated cheese or with grilled streaky bacon on top for a luxurious twist. Crusty bread on the side is all you need.



The United Reformed Church fellowship in Highworth is a faithful, thoughtful, tenacious small community, welcoming to all and worshipping in our lovely 1825 chapel on the High Street. Passing, you will perhaps best know it for the church garden which, thanks to the green fingers of Adrian, our talented gardener, offers during most of the year a pageant of everchanging beauty to make the day go better for everyone.

Thankful to be back together again after the

Covid lockdowns and under the leadership of our minister the Rev. Robert Jordan, who we share with our larger fellow church Immanuel URC in Swindon, at the moment we meet twice a month for worship on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month at 10.45am.

Thanks also to the dividend income from trust fund monies which derive from generous Victorian benefactors. After meeting our own needs we are also able to make significant charitable donations as an integral and fortunate part of our ministry.

This is our periodic report to the town on our stewardship. The gifts help the URC nationally to pay for our ministers (about 40% of the total) and are sometimes for sister churches with capital projects, but to a great degree they also fund Highworth projects and local and national charities.

'Christians Against Poverty' (CAP) has a major impact locally in helping people out of debt. It is a cooperative Highworth project among our churches with its professional team supported by



many volunteers and is often mentioned in LINK. We are the principal financial providers, without which this valuable work could not continue on its present scale.

We also offer major support to sustain the muchappreciated Lighthouse Bookshop. We support the dedicated work of Gloucester House and also church youth work in the town and in Swindon. We backed the opening of the Heritage Centre. We help the Prospect Hospice.

A range of smaller grants are given to Swindon charities, such as food bank and the women's refuge, helping people in various forms of need and to national charities. Frequently, we are able to respond to major national appeals, such as the recent cry from the Disasters Emergency Committee to fight famine in Afghanistan.

Since 2001, the total of all this giving to church and society amounts to a staggering £675,000, all of it acknowledged and appreciated and a real expression of our faith.



The 'Save Highworth's Old Golf Course' campaign has been a fantastic, constructive and very visible campaign.

As your MP and Councillors, we met with and supported the efforts of residents and the brilliant campaign group and each and every member who helped can be rightly proud of this success.

The 4,500+ strong petition, the campaign posters proudly displayed across Highworth and the work of the campaign group showed very clearly the scale of opposition to the proposed houses and new primary school.

Whilst the vast majority of Swindon's Local Plan was not contentious, Highworth has and continues to deliver more than its fair share of development in Swindon. All of this was crucial to help us focus minds. The whole principle of the Local Plan is to set out fair, sustainable and reasonable development. The additional housing at Highworth's old golf course was simply too much, an argument that thankfully won the day.

Cllrs Steve Weisinger, Vijay Manro and Alan Bishop successfully put forward an amendment to the Local Plan to remove the site. This was passed at Full Council. So the old golf course will now not be considered for housing and a new primary school.

The site will remain solely for leisure use. There is now time to work on a long-term, sustainable plan that protects the site both now and in the future. Swindon Borough Council, Highworth Town Council, the Action Group and your Councillors will work together to explore future options. I will continue to offer my support and advice to this work.




