"I know you!"

Seemingly innocuous words, yet considering the situation, they held an air of threat. I was with an outreach team in Swindon late one evening where we had gone to meet, chat, pray and buy food for the homeless.

Now, in a badly lit, cold and dirty area of an underground carpark, we had engaged with a group who were obviously under the influence and things were tricky. Then one

guy (who was a lot bigger than me) gets up really close and utters those words, "I know you!" Slightly surprised, we both stared at each other trying to work out if this was true and, if so, where we had met. "Didn't you come into Gloucester House?" he blurts out.

Suddenly, I recognise him. Serving at Gloucester House, the only Salvation Army run drug and alcohol rehabilitation centre in the country (we are so proud that it's in Highworth) is a great privilege. The team there are amazing and weekin-week-out go above and beyond, doing all they can to see lives changed. It's 'lives on the line'



work and sadly not everyone can stay the course.

Then his eyes cleared, his speech became more coherent, and in a moment of clarity he said, "You know, I never got it." (referring to the 12-step programme at Gloucester House) "I never understood what it was all about. It's about... surrender."

Surrender. Recognising we can't do it all. Honestly facing our inadequacies

and failures. Surrender. Stopping putting me and mine first. Surrender. Realising life is bigger, more powerful, more challenging than I ever imagined and the only way through is to let others in and, in my belief, let God in.

There, at the bottom of the pile, immersed in the mess of this life, that man saw something and had a revelation. The question for him, and for you and me, is can we have the guts to follow up and walk that road out?

Can we surrender?

Trouble at the Dinosaur Café



Flying with your feet on the ground

From a very early age, I have always had a fascination and interest in all things aviation. As a young lad, I made rubber-powered models made of balsa wood, covered in tissue and dope. Invariably they crashed as, at that time, I did not have the understanding of balancing and

trimming a model aeroplane. I was also fascinated watching older lads fly control line models on a local sports field which further fuelled my interest. Some 32 years ago, I took up the hobby again when a friend of mine started flying radio-controlled model aircraft. He had joined the Swindon Model Aero Club which, at that time, operated from Wroughton airfield.

Back then, I was very impressed with the controllability of model planes with the latest radio control equipment and my interest was immediately rekindled. Within weeks, I had bought a radio control package, built a small trainer plane with an engine and joined the Swindon club, I soon learned

that a club is by far the best route to go as you have the benefit of many experienced members who can help, advise and teach you to fly and, if necessary, take over flying your model plane if you get into trouble.

Over the years, the hobby has transformed considerably from basic kits you had to build entirely to buying a pre-built model plane in a box. These pre-built planes are called ARTF's which stands for 'Almost Ready To Fly.' All that is required with ARTF's is basic assembly, installation of a motor and radio gear and you are ready to go flying in no time. The radio control equipment we use today has improved considerably over the years; it is extremely reliable, sophisticated and relatively low cost.

Since retiring, I have built numerous models and my enthusiasm for building is equal to my enthusiasm for flying. During the Coronavirus

lockdowns, I kept myself occupied by building a WW2 P51D Mustang fighter with a wingspan of 90". Currently, I have eight powered model aircraft with wingspans ranging from 5ft to 9ft. They all take off, fly, and land just as their fullsize counterparts.

> In 2014, the Swindon Model Aero Club had to vacate the Wroughton site due to the installation of solar panels so now we fly at Shrivenham. The club shares the same site with the Vale of White Horse Gliding Club at Sandhill airfield and we have the benefit of a long, well-mown grass strip to fly off as well as a clubhouse with all facilities. Flying is conducted safely over open farmland and well away from housing or the general public.

The Swindon Model Aero Club has around 50 members and is affiliated to the British Model Flying Association (BMFA), providing members with appropriate insurance and compliance with the Civil Aviation Authority

Drone/Model Aircraft Regulation and Education Scheme. During the winter months, the club has monthly social evenings at a local community centre. These include talks, demonstrations and videos

Young people can certainly learn a lot from the hobby, not just aeronautics and flying, but modelling skills, understanding plans and instructions as well as how the radio control equipment works. The club always welcomes new members so, if you have an interest in model aircraft flying or would like further information, the club's contact details can be obtained from the Swindon Model Aero Club's website at www.SMAC2000.org.uk and on our Facebook page.

What is a Qualifying Year for state pension purposes?

To get the maximum Basic State Pension, you must have 35 qualifying years (which means you must have made National Insurance contributions for 35 years).

For the current tax year -2022/23 – this would mean a salary of more than £6,396. Above this figure, you start paying National Insurance at 0% - which counts as a qualifying year. At a salary level of £9,880, the Employee's National Insurance rate increases to

13.25%. (Employer's National insurance at 15.05% begins at a salary level of £9,100).

Repair Café in Highworth

Are you interested in repairing items rather than having the expense of buying new ones? Do you have skills to support residents in Highworth to help repair items rather than having them go to landfill? If so, Highworth Town Council would like to hear from you. The Environmental Sustainability Committee is investigating piloting a Repair Café within the Town.

Repair Cafés are meeting spaces where you can come along and find out how to get help in repairing household items. The aim is to prolong the life of an object and reduce items going to landfill. At a Repair Café, there will be tools and materials available to help you repair your items. These may be items of furniture, electrical goods, bicycles, crockery, toys or tools; essentially, anything that is broken but repairable. Volunteers at the Repair Café might stipulate

certain items that they will focus on according to their own expertise. The aim is to repair the object and for you to learn how to make future repairs. All repairs will be free with a request for contributions for materials.

Update on the Old Golf Course

Whilst Swindon Borough Council's decision on 20th January to remove Highworth's Old Golf Course from the current Local Development Plan was a great result, an enormous amount of work now lies ahead to ensure that this wonderful space remains open, green, accessible and undeveloped.

To that end, a small number of the Old Golf Course Action Group's core team have formed a collaborative Working Party with Highworth Town Council to pull together ideas and proposals for recreational uses for the Old Golf Course land that will generate income for its sustainment whilst preserving its unique nature. By time of reading, this Working Party will have met three times and begun to scope ideas and their realistic feasibility. The aim is to develop a Business Case to present through HTC to SBC later this year as they undertake their deliberations on the land's longer-term future.

Whilst the Action Group has a very good idea of the thoughts of its own members and of those other Highworth and Borough residents that completed the survey in the run up to last year's Local Plan consultation period, there will be plenty of other good ideas out there. To become reality however, most of them will need to be capable of generating revenue.


We believe that the best way to ensure that these ideas are considered alongside the Old Golf Course's place in the wider Highworth Neighbourhood Plan is for them to be heard at the HTC Neighbourhood Plan Workshop on Saturday 21 May and we would encourage all of those who have strong feelings about the Old Golf Course to take part in that and subsequent HTC consultation activities.

With SBC indicating that the next iteration of their Local Plan is likely to be issued for consultation at the end of this year (we will be watching and reading it very carefully!) there is a clear need for Highworth to offer potential means of allowing SBC to keep the Old Golf Course green, open, accessible and undeveloped whilst, effectively, paying its own way.

We in the Action Group look forward to your help and support in achieving this over the coming months. There is much more for us all to do!

When a friend suggested the site for Bloomfields in our High Street, Sue Belcher of Watchfield was bowled over. "What a location, overlooking Market Place," she immediately thought. The store is a haven for niche food and drink products. The Highworth store opened in 2009, quickly winning the Swindon New Business Award. "That really got the ball rolling," she says.

Sue's parents had a traditional newsagent shop in Gloucester trading as Paterson's, her mother's family name. Sue picked up the retail trade bug from them, especially her dad. "So when starting my own business, it was important to see his name, Bloomfield, on my shop."

The original Bloomfields delicatessen started in Shrivenham in 2006 in a small shop by the bank. In 2016, Tim joined the business and they relocated to a prominent High Street location in a remodelled former motor garage of distinctive 1930s design, a site that Sue has continued to expand and improve.

There are approximately 20 staff employed across both stores, including Sue and her husband Tim. Regular Highworth team members include Laura, Jenny, Julie, Bianca, Shannon, Sam, Rojina, Karen and Nicole.

"It's the staff who pulled the business through the pandemic," Sue recalls. "In the lockdown, it would have been easy to close. But we had a great sense of purpose. The girls were so determined to keep us going."

By 2016, Bloomfields had outgrown its rented premises in Highworth. They took a risk and bought the building, opening up the retail space with a new steel frame and improving the kitchen facilities on both floors. There is also a large 'room with a view' upstairs available for catered meetings. The Highworth and Shrivenham stores complement one another, share the food preparation and swap some staff.

Tim Belcher is Bloomfields' Mr Fixit. He oversaw the exhausting building work and keeps everything running smoothly. Tim handles their social media advertising, writes proposals, runs the home delivery (something they expanded considerably during the lockdown) and their outside catering service.

Bloomfields responded to the pandemic by introducing a colourful range of locally sourced fruit and vegetables. They also introduced 'home cooked' ready meals, which most of the staff are engaged in. (I can confirm these are quite nourishing and yummy!)

Attention gin fans! Sue has established the Bloomfields' label. You'll find diverse ingredients such as juniper, lavender, rosemary, citrus and coriander in a classic dry gin made by Wood Brothers Distillery in Bampton.

They took a punt on diversifying in the pandemic and it has paid off. It's the good footfall of repeat customers who buy a few items each that makes the deli a viable and valued shop in our increasingly busy town centre. Hail another High Street Hero: Sue Belcher.



Fairford and District Choral Society Review April 2022

It was good to attend a pleasurable concert by the Fairford and District Choral Society which took place on 02 April 2022 after the enforced pandemic break. As we move from a difficult

winter into Spring, I was struck by the sense of optimism which infused the evening from the first note to the last

Part 1 of the concert was devoted to works by Mozart, beginning with an energetically executed performance of Mozart's Overture in C, K399, 'in Baroque style' by organist Robin Baggs and culminating in the composer's 'Mass in B flat' K.275, a bright and joyful work featuring SATB soloists

juxtaposed with the choir. The diction and vocal precision of both choir and soloists in this work, under the direction of conductor, Katrine Reimers, was impressive, as it was throughout the concert.

The four professional soloists: Charlotte Newstead (Soprano); Olivia Gomez (Alto); John Bacon (Tenor) and William Stevens (Bass), took us through a range of solos and ensembles throughout the evening, beautifully complementing the choir and each displaying a wide range of vocal tone colour, admirable breath management and soaring legato lines.

However, for me, the outstanding performance of the evening was the first item of Part 2, 'Mendelssohn's 'Hear my Prayer', so sensitively executed by the soprano soloist and equally well delivered by the choir. I like Mendelssohn suna with the discipline of Bach (whose works the 19c composer championed), so that the romanticism in the music speaks for itself. Charlotte's sensitive. lyrical legato line and her subtly managed dynamic nuances were here equally matched throughout by the choir,

resulting in romantic warmth coupled with 'baroque' precision. This allowed the sensitivity, shape and drama of this lovely work to shine through. Bravo!

The Mendelssohn led us to other short romantic items and the programme concluded with Franz Schubert's 'Magnificat in C' featuring both choir and soloists; a delightful end to an enjoyable evening.

Chichester is now up and running and so we decided to take a trip in our van to the other Lions Clubs in North Wiltshire to collect their spectacles and deliver them to Chichester. Job done!



I come from a family of teachers, and ensuring that all children have the best education and opportunities has been a really important issue for me throughout my time in politics.

Having gone to a school at the bottom of the league tables, and seeing friends go down the wrong path, I absolutely understand the importance of a quality education and plentiful opportunities for young people. The Government recently announced the Education White Paper, Opportunities for All and the SEND and Alternative Provision Green Paper. Both papers set out detailed plans to improve provision.

Since 2010 we have already seen significant improvements in Swindon. Funding per pupil is up significantly and, in addition to various school expansions and improvements, we have delivered eight new Primary Schools and three new Secondary Schools.

Alongside the White Paper, and following a review which recognised the system was not delivering the improved outcomes it should be for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities, despite increased investment, the Government has also announced a SEND and alternative provision green paper.

The green paper will consult on a stronger national system for SEND children, and will support young people in Swindon to access more specialist and supported mainstream places, improve the system of assessment and decision making and address the issues of integrating health services.

I am passionate about ensuring young people have a solid foundation on which to build success in later life and a good education is a vital part of this. I will continue to encourage the Government to push further in areas such as: allowing communities to hold academies to account, extending after-school and holiday clubs and highlighting the importance of STEM subjects to equip students with the skills for new hi-tech jobs.

Every child deserves access to the opportunities which allow them to fulfil their potential and, as ever, I am happy to feed in any of your suggestions on what more needs to be done.



Lechlade Repair Café

On 12 March, the very first Lechlade Repair Café was launched in the Memorial Hall, Lechlade.

The Repair Café concept came from Martine Postma in Amsterdam in 2007 who, in 2011, went on to create the Repair Café International Foundation, which has grown to 2,295 registered Repair Cafés globally, 205 of which are in the UK.

As a journalist reporting on the ever-evolving issues around global climate change, Martine saw a significant annual increase in the volume and range of household appliances, goods and personal tech items ending up in landfill. This is primarily because manufactures are allowed to build in obsolescence and limit spare parts availability so they push the consumer to have the latest and greatest gizmo, with total disregard for environmental impact.

For the past four years, I have helped run and organise the successful Cirencester Repair Café as the technical lead repairer, helping other volunteers develop their skills and confidence to repair customer's and their own faulty items. The oldest kitchen appliance I have repaired, extending its working life, is a 53-year-old Kenwood Chef food mixer. They don't make them like they used to!

The list of portable household appliances we will attempt to repair or fix is extensive: from kettles, toasters, hairdryers, food mixers, soup makers,

vacuum cleaners, clocks, TV's, radios, CD players, PC's, laptops, sewing and some textile repairs, to toys and bicycles. We will have a go at fixing it!

Three like-minded volunteers and I opened the doors at the Lechlade Memorial Hall to offer our community repair service to Lechlade, Fairford, Highworth and all surrounding villages. As a not-for-profit volunteer group, we rely on generous customer donations to cover the cost of hiring the Memorial Hall room and to replenish consumables used for the repair. We still need some specialist tool kits and a Portable Appliance Tester, which are expensive, but necessary, items.

The Lechlade Repair Café meets every second Saturday of the month. The doors open to the public at 9.30am and we repair up to 12 noon, with the doors closing at 12.30pm.

In the near future, we will have a Facebook page where we will list the full range of appliances and products we can attempt to repair. This will also be a space where customers can ask questions and get advice on how to make simple repairs themselves.

New volunteer repairers are always welcome. If you are a skilled tradesperson, a DIY repairer or simply wish to help with receiving and booking in customer items, please contact me. We are also looking into running an actual café selling teas, coffee and cake. If there are any volunteers wishing to be part of or to help run this new part of the venture, I would love to hear from you.

We look forward to seeing you at our next Repair Café on **Saturday 07 May**.
