First Thoughts

Jubilee celebrations are all around us! This month we mark the 70th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth's reign and all over the country communities have been planning ways to celebrate this Platinum occasion.

I have memories of the Silver Jubilee in 1977 because I was only five years old and we made flags in school, but I don't recall much of the Golden Jubilee or even the one that was marked ten years ago. I'm sure that the Platinum Jubilee will be more memorable, coming as it does on the back of a very unusual two years when our opportunities to gather and celebrate have been so limited. We're probably all ready for a party!

There is a long history of Jubilee that actually has nothing to do with celebrating the reign of a monarch. We can find it in the Hebrew Bible, written several thousand years ago. For the communities of ancient Israel, every 50th year was a Jubilee year. It was a way in which the people affirmed their trust in God's faithfulness and provision and it was a call to the rich to trust that if they treated their creditors compassionately they would still get an adequate return. The Jubilee was a year in which those in slavery were to be set free, debts were to be written off and property restored to people. It was a year to

focus on living simply and in gratitude to God. It was a year to remember that we are all bound together by our common humanity and that where one person suffers or is in need we are all diminished.



Right now we are in a cost of living crisis. Prices are rising uncontrollably and many people are facing impossible choices; do we heat the house or eat today? Even people who six months ago felt reasonably comfortable are feeling the pinch and only the very wealthy seem to have any way to absorb these everyday increases. In the light of this injustice, wouldn't it be amazing if we could mark this Jubilee in a much more radical way? Wouldn't it be

amazing if people could be given a way out of financial slavery? Wouldn't it be amazing if debts could be written off and people's sense of dignity and worth restored? Wouldn't it be amazing if this Jubilee marked the beginning of a profound change in mindset and practice for all those who hold any kind of power, so that when we look back on the 70th anniversary of the Queen's reign we can see it reflected in a better way of life, with greater equity and fairness for all?

30 volunteers from the Highworth branch of Christians Against Poverty (CAP) recently put on a lovely event for the many households they are supporting! Thank you so much to all who made this possible! An Easter egg hunt, handmade craft activities, kid's colouring competition, delicious dinner and desserts and take-home Easter eggs, all thanks to the Co-op and other generous donors, who made the event special for those who attended.

As costs of living rise and debts become harder to manage, CAP are working hard to help as many

as they can. Since opening the Highworth branch eight years ago, we have seen over 60 households go debt-free and continue to have appointments available for free, professional debt advice.

CAP also helps in other ways:

- CAP Job Club courses are designed to help jobseekers gain the tools and confidence they need to get back to work. Over 50% of the course attendees have found work.
- CAP Lifeskills courses are friendly, communitybased groups that work to help attendees gain the needed skills to lift the pressures of life on a low income. So far we have helped over 50 households through this course.



 CAP Money is a short, three-session money management course to enable you to feel in control of your finances.





Each season brings a specific resonance to us. Spring is like 'The Great Unfolding'. Activity increases as plans start to roll out and action is







Can HMRC make me bankrupt

If you have a Limited Company, your personal assets (including your house) are generally not at risk (a benefit of having a Limited Company). But if you borrowed money from your Company (a director's loan), or you personally guaranteed any bank loans for your Company, your personal assets may be at risk.

If the tax you owe relates to a sole-trader business or to investment income or Capital Gains, you will owe the tax personally. This means that you could possibly lose personal assets to HMRC if you cannot pay it. However, you might still safeguard your house by negotiating an affordable repayment plan with HMRC. If you ignore the debt, you are very likely to be chased by HMRC Debt Management department.

HIGH STREET HEROES

'We worked our butts off during Covid.'

I was truly inspired by my chat with Claire Waldron, manager of Highworth Travel. The pandemic was a doublewhammy for them.

Like so many businesses, the company had zero sales during most of the 18-month emergency (March 2020 to September 2021). But to compound

their woes, the team spent a lot of their downtime issuing refunds for planned travel that simply could not happen. These refunds included commissions earned on pre-pandemic sales. Ouch!

Opened in 1983, Highworth Travel is a completely independent travel agency operating at 27 High Street (www.highworthtravel.co.uk). Operationally, they share some booking processes with Advantage Travel, a consortium of independent travel agents. "We do it all from initial enquiry, through booking, ticketing and being on standby to resolve the occasional hiccup," says Claire. She joined the business straight from school in 1986 and has maintained her enthusiasm for travel ever since. Like her colleagues, Nikki Doré and Lynne Richards, Claire is personable, someone you immediately feel is trustworthy and 'on your side' as travel gets more complicated.

Recently, a very satisfied customer posted this message on a local Facebook page: "I cannot begin to say how good they are," he praised. Clearly others think so too because this gushing post attracted 25 universally positive comments and 160 'likes'. Oh wow, what a team, and right here on our doorstep. No endless waiting in a queue on a phone call that's never answered, or a naff email from an airline saying how "terribly sorry" they are for cancelling your flight.

Highworth Travel trades on personal service. "We

get to know our clients and what they like," Claire explains. "A problem won't be passed to someone anonymous in Customer Services. The buck stops here; we deal with it."

But surely it's so easy to book travel online these days, I ask. "I think Covid has taught travellers that they'd like to

have someone to speak to when something goes wrong," Claire replies. "If there are any issues they can ask us." And of course, a good travel agent knows how to join together the various strands of any itinerary.

A few years ago, before I knew about Highworth Travel, I booked a long-distance flight using an apparently reputable national chain. When we got to Heathrow (in plenty of time), the check-in had long closed. We were rushed through the airport and only just made our flight in a stressed-out state of exhaustion. When we got home, I asked the faraway agent how this happened. "Didn't you get our email about the earlier departure time?" he asked. Surely something so important needs a phone call, the kind of personal touch you'd expect from a local trader with a jealously-guarded local reputation.

The reason Highworth Travel has survived is the underlying support of their London-based owner, Elliot Cohen, and prudent drawing on emergency loans to tide them over. The whole team is determined to see the business recover and to get over this financial hurdle. It's relieved smiles all round as customers re-engage with UK and international travel and shop locally.



Flying School, and once flew solo as far as the Arctic Circle.



As the 299 runners were given their pre-race brief minutes before the start of the Highworth 5-Mile Race in April, a mass round of applause escaped such was the harboured relief that finally, maybe things were back to normal. 1099 Days after the last event it was an emotional return for everyone, especially for former Highworthian Gary O'Brien who ran in his father Peter's memory; a pillar of the club's committee and key presence the last time the race was held. It was lovely to witness one of the original club vests seeing the light of day again and circulating with such pride.

To complete the canvas, the weather could not have been kinder, with a minus two degrees start to the day it warmed up to leave a beautifully bright and crisp spring morning that everyone seemed to enjoy. With spirits high, the one-lap course still held on to its devilish sting as runners were treated to Eastrop Hill at four miles. First across the line was Ed Knudsen representing Avon Valley Runners. After only 25 minutes and 20 seconds of running that most would call sprinting, he described the slight inconvenience of the climb back into Highworth as a "cheeky little hill". We asked around and no-one else shared this view. Chippenham's Jake Stevens and Royal Wootton Bassett's Michael Gilbert completed the podium.

In the ladies' race and entering herself into the club's record books as the first HRC member to win the race since it was first held in 1986; Kiya Dee crossed the line in 30:28 minutes, 38 seconds ahead of Chippenham's Emma Hines ahead of Marlborough's Jessica White. In another first for the club, the team award, calculated from the first three club members to cross the line, HRC earned third place courtesy of Michael Passmore finishing in 5th place, Kiya in 15th and Rhys Millet in 22nd.

Other more localised accolades were earned by John Cornago and Elle Jackson who were the first town residents to complete the course. Congratulations to all those who ran and made the day as fulfilling for the club as hopefully it was for those who took part. Welsh Athletics Hall of Fame and Awards Dinner: John Linden Merriman

The Vale Hotel in Pontyclun was the stunning venue for the Welsh Athletics Annual Awards evening on Saturday 5th March. My Mum, Diana, and I had been invited by Welsh Athletics historian, Clive Williams, to witness my father's induction into their Hall of Fame. The event was attended by around 200 people, comprising club members, coaches and officials.

At intervals during a three-course meal, presentations were made. Then it was the turn of the inductees, including my dad, John Merriman.

For the first time in my life I saw footage, albeit grainy, of my father as he competed in the 1958 Empire (now Commonwealth) Games sixmile race in Cardiff. We watched the last 50 metres or so as he was

beaten into second place by Aussie, Dave Power. My dad was the only Welshman to win a medal at those Games.

He didn't quite manage to repeat his heroics four years later in Perth, Australia, but a bronze was a respectable result nonetheless. In-between times he finished eighth in the 1960 Rome Olympics, becoming the first Britain to clock a time of under 29 minutes; all in the same six-mile/10,000 metre event.

We were both honoured to receive the award plus a vase and a plaque with the Welsh Athletics crest and Dad's name. Dad would have been so proud. Sadly, as many of you will know, he passed away in 1999. It was a proud night for us both, the audience getting a glimpse of his silver and bronze medals which my mum had brought with us.

From our MP

Recently there was a rare moment of cross-party cooperation in Parliament as MPs came together to discuss the very important issue of childhood cancer. My friend, Caroline Dineage MP, organised a debate on childhood cancer outcomes, inspired by ten-year-old Sophie Fairall, who tragically passed away after battling a rare and aggressive cancer.

If we are to improve the cancer care treatment for children and teenagers diagnosed with cancer, then we have to really understand their experiences. That is why I was pleased to see that the first Under-16 Cancer Patient Experience Survey was published by NHS England in October 2021, following the campaigning of charities like Young Lives vs Cancer and Teenage Cancer Trust.

Parliament can often be a very adversarial place so it was nice to see such unity on this very important topic. The debate allowed MPs to share their own experiences, or those of their constituents which although very moving and sometimes difficult to listen to, provided some vital insight.

My contribution to the debate focused on calling for improved peer-to-peer support, linking up families with those who are also going through the same thing, so they can help each other through such incredibly difficult circumstances.

This was a very tough debate to listen to, but if it can improve diagnosis and treatment for children and young people with cancer, then it is absolutely worth it.

I, like many residents, love football, so I was very pleased to see the Government accept all ten recommendations from the Fan Led Review of Football, which was led by my good friend, Tracey Crouch MP.

We should be very proud that the Premier League is the most successful in the world, the Championship is the fourth largest league and our national team can compete with anyone on their day. However, too often fans have felt powerless, with their beloved club facing a number of challenges, either financial or with unscrupulous owners, as Swindon Town fans know all too well.

The Government's plans will establish an independent regulator focused on financial sustainability, a strengthened approach to owners and directors test and will seek to give fans a greater say in the running and protection of their clubs.

The outcome of the Fan Led Review presents an opportunity to change our national game for the better and I am glad plans have been welcomed by fans. The changes will filter down through the leagues, which would benefit our local clubs including Swindon Town, Swindon Supermarine and Highworth Town. I would also expect greater support at grassroot level, with clubs like Highworth Juniors so vital to our local community.

The proposed changes will be debated further as legislation is brought forward in the coming months, but the Premier League, EFL and FA should crack on and not wait for us politicians to force changes through legislation.



INGLESHAM

A Cotswolds Cruise Caper

In 1789, a canal system was finally completed to link the River Severn at Framilode with the River Thames at Inglesham. With the advent of firstly, the Kennet and Avon canal and secondly, the railways, the Cotswolds canal declined in use. In 1911, the last transit of a working boat was recorded, with the eastern end of the canal being abandoned in 1927. Today, evidence of the canal can be seen west of Lechlade at the Inglesham Roundhouse and newly restored lock, with plans to restore the canal eastwards.

However, it is hoped that a number of canal boats of the Cotswolds Canal Cruising Club will be able to enter the Inglesham lock 111 years after its last use. One of those boats, NB 'ELEMIAH', is owned by a local resident. This event is due to take place over the weekend of 11 and 12 June.


