#### New, Free Budgeting Course in Highworth

The churches in Highworth have run debt charity Christians against Poverty's (CAP's) Life Skills course for five years and are launching a new eight-week course for people in Highworth this autumn.

The free course gives people the confidence and decision-making skills to live well for less, look after themselves and feel positive, even if they are on a low income. It focuses on:

- How to deal with the pressure to spend
- How to decide where your money should be going
- Cooking cheap but healthy meals
- Spotting a good deal
- Improving relationships

Eoli Pieri, CAP Life Skills Manager said, 'Living, as we do, in times when the price of so many essentials is increasing, Life Skills can help people cope more easily on a limited budget. It's a series of lovely, relaxed sessions where people can interact with each other and learn new skills which enable them to take control of their finances. Most of all, it will be a time to share what works and what doesn't, both as a group

and one-to-one, and to give each other encouragement to do things better. It will be some of those key things you wished they had taught you at school, but didn't. We want to help people in Highworth to take back control of their money and live much happier lives, free of financial pressure.'

The course starts on **Tuesday 20 September**, 1pm till 2.30pm, at The Bridge Centre in Sheep Street, and will include a free light lunch.

#### From One Driving Seat to Another

Our Mayor, Julie Murphy, has two very different aspects to her life that are poles apart. She puts

on the Mayor's chain to chair the meetings of Highworth Town Council and represent the Town at public events and in her spare time she puts on her race suit and helmet to co-drive in a Subaru rally car.

The rallying came about due to her friendship with Shellv

Taunt. They both grew up in Highworth and Shelly's dad was a rally driver, so they both used to travel the country to watch. "I'll always have fond memories of sitting on hay bales in the middle of the night on Salisbury Plain listening to the distinctive sound of the Audi Quattro and Mark II Escorts roaring past on rallies like the Lombard Rally. I just wanted to compete," Julie recalls.

Although Shelly and Julie always kept in touch, they took different life paths. Julie's career took her travelling the UK, whilst Shelly won a competition to be sponsored for a year's rallying by Do It All; this started her rallying career.

In 2004, Julie purchased a brand new Subaru from Simpsons in Highworth and, at the same time, Shelly asked Julie to co-drive a Subaru rally car. Julie knew joining a former British champion was going to be a challenge, but Julie was up for it!

Initially they did a single venue on tarmac. "The smell of the fuel and constantly being thrown about whilst trying to read notes made me so car sick," Julie grimaces, but she finished the event

and won the Spirit of the Rally award. She was determined not to give up on future events.



The next event was in Yorkshire, on gravel. The heavy snow made it more challenging but they settled in well to the stages and by the end of the event they got maximum points for the BTRDA Championship. The girls soon developed their own system of working together and,

at the end of the year, won their class in the Championship.

The team have since competed all over the UK, Northern Ireland, the Isle of Man and Barbados and have been invited to Goodwood's Festival of Speed by the Duke of Richmond on seven occasions.

Julie said, "Co-driving has many responsibilities to it, including organising the team, working out fuel quantities, tyre choices, telling the driver exactly where to go on road sections, reading pace notes to the driver whilst racing on the stages and making sure of arrival at time controls exactly on the minute due. It wasn't an easy job at first but, after years of experience competing, we are a very competitive team. You have to trust each other as consequences can be serious if you get it wrong, but we love it. It is interesting participating in a male-dominated sport and we all get on very well. Our success over the years wouldn't be possible without the support of our great service crew who work really hard to keep the car going. It's a real team effort."

#### **Ask AMS**

What should I do when employing someone for the first time?

The most important things are:

- You must pay at least the National Minimum wage.
- Get Employers' Liability insurance
- Send a written job description (including Terms & Conditions) to your employee.
- When employing someone for over 1 month, give them a written statement of employment.
- Register as an employer with HMRC (do this 4 weeks before paying your employee, and get some Payroll software that can deal with Real Time Information submissions).
- Prepare to auto enrol eligible employees into a company pension scheme.
- If your business works with vulnerable people or security, apply for a DBS check (formerly CRB)
- Don't leave everything till the last minute!

#### **Highworth Neighbourhood Plan**

Highworth Neighbourhood Plan2 (HNP2) is about to go into its second phase of preparation, thanks to the help and opinions of so many residents and businesses. Your responses to the

surveys and your comments from the workshops and focus groups will now be pored over and we will endeavour to find a pathway towards a future Highworth that both meets the needs of the town and the approval of the people who live and work here. We will be publishing these results gradually over the next few months.

With the help of our consultant, who is provided through a government grant, we will be starting to formulate policies which will be the basis of Plan 2. To help us with this, we have other expert teams looking at housing design and advising on the different sorts of houses Highworth will most likely need in the future. Thanks to the help of a local planner, we now have a collection of statistics that will provide the objective evidence an examiner requires.

For the next few months, work will be done in the office and in the NHP2 committee. These committee meetings are open to the public to listen, but protocols do not permit participation.

> However, ten minutes are allocated at the beginning of each meeting for members of the public to ask questions. They usually take place on the last Tuesday of the month in the morning; agendas can be found on the Highworth Town Council website.

> Our timeline for producing a revised plan is also governed, to some extent, by Swindon Borough Council's

Emerging Local Plan, the draft of which was recently withdrawn and is now not expected until early 2023.

Keep an eye on our website highworthtowncouncil.gov.uk, where any key events will be published. Highworth Town Council is keen to maintain its policy of openness and transparency.

#### Former Dovecote at Sevenfields

In early July, Sandra, Mandy and I delivered 352 flyers to homes in Sevenfields, The Knowlands and Edencroft, asking the residents to email or phone 'yes' if they wished to have the dovecote replaced. The closing date for replies was 22 July.

Of the 352 possible responses, nine people telephoned and 64 emailed 'yes'. 73 replies worked out as just under 21% of households in favour.

I will take this information back to Highworth Community Partnership Group in September to see what their opinion is, but I fear it may be too small a return to move the project forward.

Although there is the potential for half the cost to be raised through a grant, we shall still have to find the other half and the cost of erecting it. As it is on Swindon Borough Council land, we have to use one of their trusted contractors who will need to prepare a risk assessment and have their own Public Liability insurance. We will then have to purchase our own Public Liability insurance, which is renewed annually, plus arrange an annual inspection. As well as the basic cost, we will need an additional kitty to cover the ongoing costs.

I point all this out now as the next time you receive news will be November. I will leave Highworthdovecote@gmail.com open for the time being and look at it during September/October. If anyone thinks they have a bright idea, jot it down with your email and I will get back to you.

Sorry I cannot be more upbeat.

#### **Update on the Old Golf Course**

By the time this edition of Link magazine hits doorsteps, the beautiful summer weather will (hopefully) be at its best, allowing Highworthians to fully enjoy the beauty of the Old Golf Course. The reappearance of some truly amazing flora and fauna, even over the last few months, beautifully photographed and shared by several talented Highworth residents, has been a joy to watch. 'Barney' the Barn Owl and our resident fox family have been particular favourites in this household.

Behind the scenes, the Highworth Old Golf Course Action Group has been meeting and working regularly with Highworth Town Council, our three Swindon Borough Councillors and our MP, to maintain the momentum gained back in January. In particular, work should (by the time of reading) now be well underway to gather viable plans for the use of the Old Golf Course that generate meaningful income to help contribute to the cost of its maintenance as open, accessible green space; ideally with long-term, protected Park or Local Green Space status.

The intent is to gather locally generated and delivered ideas into a Business Case/Usage

Proposal to present to SBC towards the end of the year that will be sufficiently viable and sustainable to secure their support for the Old Golf Course being leased to HTC long-term, with the revenue generated from the several business ideas funding, or significantly contributing to, its maintenance as open, accessible green space.

It is believed that such an approach will allow Swindon Borough to be an exemplar to others across the country in terms of utilising their green space to combat climate change, promote biodiversity, contribute to Central Government green targets and support their ever-increasing number of borough residents' physical and mental health and wellbeing.

This endeavour will require support from Highworth and Swindon Borough residents and we ask that you all keep the Old Golf Course in the public eye: keep those fantastic photographs and posts coming! Even better, spread them far and wide so that the widest audience possible understands how important this amazing piece of green space is to so many people.

#### **Town Twinning: Recent and Future Visits**

Most Highworth residents will probably know from the 'Welcome to Highworth' signs at the side of the road that our town is twinned with Pontorson in Normandy, France, and Wassenberg, North Rhein Westphalia, Germany. In May this year, I was fortunate, as the Twinning Association's Chairman, to visit both towns in the space of three weeks.

For a long time, a small park near the centre of Pontorson and by the river Couesnon, has been called Highworth Square. It has recently been rejuvenated and part now resembles a Roman amphitheatre as you can see from the photo. A vote was made to retain the name of Highworth Square. Furthermore, the red UK telephone box, which had stood at the other end of town, has now been moved to a position overlooking the park.

In Wassenberg, a disused railway track has been cleared to make a path for cyclists and pedestrians from one side of the town to the other (sound familiar?). The decision was to call the path Highworth Lane and it leads to Pontorson Platz. At the inauguration, I was honoured by being asked to join with their mayor to cut the tape. As I was in Wassenberg just before the Queen's Jubilee Celebrations, I presented a commemorative flag which Highworth Council kindly donated. The flag received a round of applause and I've learned there is a lot of interest in our Royal Family in Germany.

Indeed, we are continuing a programme of gradually replacing those troughs showing signs of distress after several years of use.

We are grateful to the Town Council grounds staff who have recently taken on responsibility for the two planters by the Highworth Town entrance signs on the A361 and Lechlade Road.

Some of our volunteers have been looking after troughs for the full duration of the scheme, some ten years. Unfortunately, for various reasons, some are having to relinquish their responsibilities and we are looking for new volunteers, perhaps a little younger than those who are having to retire.

There are two areas in particular where we are looking for help: the troughs against the town gardens wall in The Elm, and the trough and bus stop planting at the top of The Willows. If you live in the rough proximity of these two areas and would like to contribute to a really positive community initiative, please can I ask you to get in touch. The costs of all plants and compost can be covered by the scheme.

Of course, our particular thanks go to our retiring volunteers who have given so much to the scheme.

#### 'We listen, we take note, we do!'

Interviewing Helen Lacey and Sandra Rendall, I realised four of my five stories in this series were about women entrepreneurs.

Fearing a foot-inmouth moment I nevertheless ploughed on and asked them why this is. Sandra's quick reply sums up nicely why women often thrive in business, especially in publicfacing roles: "We listen, we take note, we do!"

Sandra is secretary of the Highworth Community Partnership Group (HCPG) and Visit

Highworth Limited (VHL) and was the project manager when HCPG developed the centre in the former Lloyds Bank in 2019. Helen is the Centre Manager, recruited for the launch of VHL in September 2019, Both Sandra and Helen live in Highworth.

The idea of VHL is to encourage tourism in the town and draw residents into our precious town centre. It's a shopfront for local arts and crafts, as well as hosting craft courses, a recycling point, town walks, wildlife walks and the Highworth Museum. The former bank vault, complete with its splendid door, houses the museum where the Highworth Historical Society curates objects and stories from our past.

The emphasis on merchandise is 'local'. You'll find greeting cards, calendars, carry bags, paintings, jewellery, applique (patches of fabric sewn onto a larger piece), pottery, woodwork, glass, acrylics, walking sticks and more. During the lockdown in 2020, residents Robin and Paul Moore compiled and updated the book of walks around Highworth; so popular that it's been reprinted. VHL also organises Christmas and Spring Fairs in the beautifully remodelled Saint Michael's Church.

Like other businesses, VHL's operations were

suspended in March 2020. Helen says, "We'd only been open a short time (barely six months) when everything was cancelled. We had no idea it

Helen summarises, "You might pay a little more in the High Street, but you get quality. It's about building relationships and selling things made with passion and love."

As well as her work with VHL, Sandra is often the glue that brings together our community. In 2023, after nearly ten years leading the fun May Day weekend, she is stepping down to make way for someone new to have a go. Could this be you?

Fear not, because John Kennedy says, "80% of the people with a modern point-and-shoot camera or phone get superb results."

At their first club meeting in 1982, Brian Godwin was recorded as member No. 7 and John was No. 40. Since then, a lot has happened. John explains, "The early SLR (single-lens reflex) cameras used film, precious and so expensive. Most were doing their own black and white processing, but for colour it was cheaper to go into Jessops and get a 10x8." Brian adds, "Then it was digital, and everything changed again."

John recalls, "When I started, it was very much male-dominated because it was technical and you needed to know a little about physics and chemistry to do it (which tended to be boys' subjects). Today, about a third of our members are women, infact they dominate in many areas. Barbara Thorpe must have won practically every trophy in the club with her little point-and-shoot camera. We now have a competition in her memory."

Brian says still photography remains popular, "It's this spur of the moment thing, you see

Meet Janet: a grandmother from Zimbabwe who transformed her dusty land into a garden of hope. In her village, Janet has experienced first-hand how drought pushed her family into desperate hunger.

"One year, there was so little food. Rains had not fallen. We ate

things which we wouldn't eat in normal times. I made porridge and gave it to the children, then removed a portion and put it down for the dogs. The children picked up the dogs' share because they weren't full. When I saw this, I knew the situation had become unbearable," Janet shared.

"My heart was so painful thinking that my family would die. By God's grace we did not die. We soldiered on."

With faith, hope and love for her family, Janet brought her family through this painful time with the support of Christian Aid's BRACT programme (Building Resilience through Absorptive and Adaptive Capacities for Transformation).

BRACT helps the most at-risk communities in

Zimbabwe to prepare for and adapt to the changing climate. Working with local partners,



healthier, nutritious food and gain new skills for alternative sources of income when agriculture fails.

By learning how to grow drought-resistant crops with the support of Christian Aid, Janet was able to bring her family through a painful time and turn her barren land into a garden of plenty. Now, her farm is bursting with life and she harvests enough surplus food to share with her neighbours while also storing enough to survive future droughts.

"My life is changing," Janet says. "This project is uplifting us. We are thankful."

# From our MP

I was pleased to visit Highworth Warneford School again to meet with Andy Steele, the Headteacher. I have been a long-standing supporter of the school having previously helped secure the funding for the fantastic sports hall. It was great to hear about recent progress and improvements, catchment areas and admissions, as well as plans for the future.

As many will know, one issue which I have really championed during my time as an MP is increasing cardiac arrest survival rates. This is a very personal issue for me as my father died following a cardiac arrest when I was only 12.

In the UK, there are 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests a year, however, the survival rate is low with just one in ten people in the UK surviving. Earlier this summer, the Government announced that all state-funded schools across England will receive defibrillators to make sure there is a device in every school; an estimated 20,000 will be sent out. The announcement comes after the government first committed last year to look at how to achieve a defibrillator on every school site, following a campaign by the Oliver King Foundation, a charity created in memory of 12-year-old Oliver King who tragically died following a cardiac arrest.

The news is incredibly important. Defibrillators have the potential to save the lives of pupils,

staff and visitors in schools, with latest research showing that accessing these devices within three to five minutes of a cardiac arrest increases the chance of survival by over 40%. This initiative from the Government really will save lives

The latest announcement builds on the requirement for all school children to be taught CPR as part of the national curriculum, which was something I worked closely with the British Heart Foundation to achieve.

# Heritage Open Day at Coleshill, Sunday 11 September, 10.30am – 5pm

The Victorian model farm at Coleshill was built as an exemplar farm to demonstrate the most modern farming methods of the high farming period in the 1850s. It is a unique site, built on a hill to harness gravity when moving food and manure around the site. The buildings are home to the West Oxfordshire National Trust office. Some of the spaces are being reinvented as our Heritage Skills Centre, designed to host courses in traditional crafts such as lime plastering and blacksmithing hosted by local skilled builders and crafts people. Visitors will be able to take part in guided walks of the buildings and visit the foaling house and working watermill.

This will also be the last day of our Concrete Castles exhibition featuring the contemporary art of the Second World War. Our underground operational base will also be opened where visitors can discover the secret history of the Auxiliary Units who trained at Coleshill in the 1940s.
