## Ask AMS

### Tax rules for Christmas parties

It's that time of year when most employers arrange a Christmas Party for their staff. The rules around tax relief for Christmas parties are fairly generous so long as the party is open to all employees and not just directors/management.

- Party costs (including travel etc.) are fully tax deductible if they are no more than £150 (inc. VAT) per head (including guests).
- Be careful. If, say, £200/head is spent, then the Employer will need to pay PAYE and National Insurance on the total party cost of £200/head – not just on the excess £50/head.
- The £150 is an annual limit so would cover a Summer Party and a Christmas Party in the same tax year. But, if the costs of multiple parties exceed £150/head, then an Employer could use the £150/head limit to cover the most expensive party, and only pay PAYE/NI on the other one.

## Café Church at Highworth Methodist Church

**Café Church is church with a difference. Seated round tables instead of sitting in rows, we drink coffee or tea, eat biscuits, and enjoy worship that is relaxed and informal. It is still a service; we sing a few songs, hear a bit of a talk, say some prayers, but there will be film clips, discussion and sometimes drama as well. It is a new way to explore faith and big life questions.**

Here at Highworth Methodist Church we hold our Café Church services on the **first Sunday every other month**. The church is open and serving coffee from 10am with the service starting at 10:30am. There is no charge for refreshments and

## Faringdon & District U3a

Anne-Marie Prestidge will talk about the Samaritans at our December meeting in the Corn Exchange on Thursday 8 December, starting at 2.30pm. Anne-Marie has been a listening volunteer with the Samaritans for 18 years. Her talk will cover how and why Rev. Chad Varah founded the organisation in 1953, and how it has evolved into the 24/7 service it is today.

It is a common misconception that the Samaritans was set up only to support people who had decided to end their lives prematurely. The organisation is much more than this and Anne-Marie will present some surprising statistics relating to the demographics of the incidents of suicide and the reasons why people reach the point where they believe that this is their only option. She will also discuss what it takes to become a volunteer, the personal qualities that a potential volunteer should possess and how they are trained to uphold the ethos of the organisation.

After this fascinating talk refreshments will be available to everyone, but we do ask that non-members pay £1.50 as a contribution.

All attendees are required to be in good health and up to date with all their Covid vaccinations. If in doubt, please stay at home.

## Highworth Town Council New Neighbourhood Plan (NP2)



The Neighbourhood Plan Committee are pleased to announce that further grant funding has been secured for a specialist to look at developing design codes for the updated plan. Design codes shape how development should look, depending on the location within the town. The process identifies character areas and then parameters for developers to follow. For example, it will determine what materials must be used.

The steering group spent the afternoon with the consultants, taking them around the town and the committee are awaiting a draft of their findings. The specialists are particularly focusing on the sites proposed by Swindon Borough Council in their local plan review for development in Highworth, so should the sites

come forward then Highworth will have the opportunity to have some control of what is approved. We will keep you updated on the findings when they become available.

The committee have summarised four of the five workshops and the results will be published in the near future. We will let you know more details on this shortly.

There is still lots of work to do and we will be engaging with you again soon. In the meantime good progress is being made on this key document.

# Could you be a Town Councillor?

*'You have no authority, Jackie Weaver!'*

**Do you remember the infamous YouTube clip of a parish council meeting that goes horribly wrong? Let me assure you that it will never happen at Highworth Town Council, particularly if you can be persuaded to be an independent member of the council.**

Yes, it's that time again. On Thursday 4 May 2023 registered electors will be invited to elect 15 Town Councillors to serve for the next four years. Please consider standing as an independent councillor.

What does it involve? Briefly, local councillors have three main areas of work:

1. **Decision making:** Through attending meetings and committees elected members decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.
2. **Monitoring:** Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.
3. **Getting involved locally:** As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. This often depends on what a councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available. The day-to-day work may include:
  - Going to meetings of local organisations and community groups
  - Going to meetings of bodies that affect the wider community, such as the police, schools and colleges or Swindon Borough Council.
  - Taking up issues on behalf of members of the public.
  - Running a surgery for residents to bring up issues.

I can explain much more if you come along to an introductory meeting at Highworth Community Centre, The Dormers on Thursday 19 January at 7.30pm.

## News from Westrop Medical Practice

Over the years, as well as growing in size, our workforce has also become considerably more diverse, encompassing a wide range of allied healthcare professionals. Each of these have particular skills or knowledge that can enhance patient care over and above what the more traditional doctor and nurse model would offer. Many think that we have been forced to do this due to a lack of doctors but actually the decision to embrace working alongside other healthcare professionals has service quality at its core.

We understand, however, that this can be confusing and disconcerting for patients. For years you would see a GP for any problem. For example, if you had a bad back there would only be one option – see the doctor! Now, you will be guided by the receptionists to see a physiotherapist. Or perhaps your mood is low, or you are feeling anxious, and you are advised to see one of our mental health nurses. If you are struggling with your IBS symptoms, our dietician will be offered. We also work with pharmacists who will deal with medication-related issues and minor illness, and Advanced Nurse Practitioners who can assess and treat a wide range of clinical problems. Whilst many patients are only too happy to see part of the wider team, others sometimes worry whether they would be better off seeing a GP, or that they might not be able to get the medication they need, or what if they need a fit note?

Please let me reassure you! The allied healthcare professionals we are lucky to work with are all experts in their own areas and often have experience within hospitals as well as in general practice. This gives them additional skills that allow them to help over and above what would be offered with the traditional doctor model. Many of our clinicians are prescribers, so can offer the same medication options and those that aren't can quickly and easily request a prescription when required. Likewise with fit notes. And

please also be reassured that it's very much a team effort – if the clinician you see feels you are in the wrong place, or if an opinion from a doctor is needed, this can be promptly arranged by our duty GP; as well as x-rays or any other tests which may aid diagnosis. They also often have longer appointments, which allow time for a thorough assessment.

So, returning to that patient with back pain who would have been sent to see the GP had they presented in the past, how would their care be different to how it is now? Well, when it comes to back and joint problems my options as a GP are a bit limited. Yes we can examine and assess for 'red flags' (symptoms that mean a more serious diagnosis could be underlying), we can request x-rays (although in 99% of cases these don't help), and we can issue painkillers if needed, although side effects can be problematic. Compare this to when you see a physio, someone who has years of experience purely in the management of orthopaedic problems. That extra knowledge and skill will result in a more thorough and in-depth assessment, helping you to understand better the issues you are having. A personalised exercise plan, where appropriate, can be offered, helping to actually fix the problem. If a referral is needed, or x-rays, or a fit note, these can all be arranged. So all in all a much better deal and hopefully giving the patient the best possible advice and chance of

recovery. It's the same situation when seeing any of our allied healthcare professionals.

I know in many cases I will be preaching to the converted – we were the first practice in Swindon to work alongside physios and they have long been an embedded part of our team – but for those that are yet to be convinced, please keep an open mind and let our reception team guide you to see the best professional for the problem that you have. I'm confident you will be pleasantly surprised!





## What is Gaslighting?

**Gaslighting is often present in a toxic relationship.**

The term gaslighting has received a lot of publicity following its use by a judge in a legal case regarding coercive control. Originally the term was attributed to a movie, *Gaslight*, where the perpetrator consciously and maliciously made his wife feel she was losing her mind. Amongst other things, he moved her things saying she had, and he regularly lowered and raised the gas light whilst denying any change to ensure his wife doubted her own sanity.

For example, you could be asked the question, 'Are you having an affair?' It's a valid question if you are. But if not, nor displaying any traits that could explain the question, then it could be the gaslighter projecting blame onto you when they are the one being unfaithful. They will tell lies and then deny saying them, causing you to doubt what you know is true. You find yourself apologising for things that you know were not your fault, or begin believing that everything is your fault.

Questioning their behaviour, the gaslighter's response can be, 'It's in your head. You're crazy!' By adamantly denying something they said or did on a constant basis, and by using these types of statements, the abuser can destabilise your mental health and wellbeing and distort your perception. Once you start to believe that it is in your mind then the abuser will constantly reiterate, validating that perception.

It's not in your mind and you are certainly not crazy. Remember, if your gut says something is wrong it usually is.

There is a saying that the victor writes history; so does the abuser. The gaslighter will discredit or place any culpability onto their partner For

example, they may not want to attend a party, but will say you are ill and they must look after you.

Have you been isolated from family and friends? They may make it uncomfortable for you by being moody every time you see your friends or family, or make derogatory remarks about them.

A gaslighter will shower you with love and affection, often love-bombing in the early part of the relationship, and later as a reward when their love becomes conditional. Manipulation will ensure you do what they want in the way they want it. Your boundaries will become weakened or even destroyed. If you try to reinstate them, you will be made to feel guilt that you have rejected the gaslighter. Control lies hidden, and gaslighting is a part of coercive control. Coercive control is a crime.

Is it ever too late to reverse the damage? Not at all! You need to decide that enough is enough, and you want the situation to change, then you are ready to stop being the victim and take responsibility to care for your own wellbeing. What follows is a process of rebuilding your confidence, self-esteem and, most importantly, belief in yourself, your instincts, and your choices. Healing takes some time, but your life and your happiness are worth it!

## Remembering Robert 'Bob' James Reynolds, 1920-2022

Many of you would have seen me supporting Bob around the Co-op on our twice weekly shopping trips from October 2020 to November 2021; choosing his favourite items, paying bills at the Post Office counter with the familiar friendly staff there and stopping for an occasional coffee afterwards in the coffee shop. Thank you to the Co-op staff for your friendly support of Bob over the years.

Unfortunately, after a fall in his home at the end of November last year, Bob went into GWH, then onto Sunflower Ward, where the staff surprised him with an amazing cake for his 101st birthday and I was delighted to be able to share that day with him, despite the face mask. The Cheriton Care Home then looked after him throughout this year, and many thanks are expressed to them too. Sadly, we couldn't get him fit enough to return to his beloved home in Highworth. In a recent readmission to GWH, and again many thanks to the lovely staff on Jupiter Ward for their support, I was privileged to be alongside Bob in his last hours and support his closest family as he very peacefully and gently said his last goodbye to this world, at the grand old age of 101 and 3/4!

On asking him his secret to living so long he patted his chest and replied, 'In your heart keep cheerfully optimistic each day!'. This is something I will never forget and a great outlook on life to keep in mind for all of us.

Bob had been a coach painter, like his family members before him, at the GWR Works in Swindon, breaking off his apprenticeship to serve



in World War II in the RAF Regiment, to then complete it, with great references to his accomplishments. On leaving GWR he then worked as a painter and decorator, never quite as fulfilling as working on the trains!

As a resident of Highworth since 1983, he was often seen on his many shopping trips. Bob loved to drive his car, driving gloves on as usual, and drove over to Wales on many occasions to spend time with friends and also on family visits to Clevedon. His home town of Chester was always in his heart

and he longed to return there one day. His ashes will now be placed back in Chester.

I followed Bob on our last journey together around Highworth on Monday 31

October as Hillier's took Bob's hearse around his neighbourhood, walking ahead of him up Turnpike Road, pausing at his former home at number 17 for the last time – as near to coming home as we could! We celebrated his life and shared memories together at Kingsdown Crematorium, Rev. John Martin conducted a lovely service, and then together afterwards in the Saracens Head.

For me it was a great privilege to get to know Bob and support him in his final years. Bob was a true 'Gem' and 'Wee' gentleman. Bob had a kind, quiet and caring nature and so I want to say, 'Thank you Bob for letting me walk alongside you to the end'.

He will be greatly missed both by myself and by those who knew him.

The money raised by the tearoom helped the group to purchase the empty barn on the site, with the aim of turning it into an all-weather space for people to enjoy positive creative activities. This was a bit of a gamble, as the group spent all their reserves from three years fundraising, so I am delighted that this has been so successful.




