Ask AMS

What repairs can be claimed against rental income in a Buy-to-let property?

This is a common issue when calculating net rental property income and you should seek advice.

You can claim for maintenance and repairs/ renewals. Repairing or replacing should be 'like-for-like' as much as possible but you cannot claim for repairs that constitute an improvement to the property. e.g. You may make a claim to replace a bath but not for installing an extra shower unit.

You can also claim for repairs incurred in preparing the property for rental. Pre-letting expenses are treated as incurred on the first day of rental. Repairs incurred prior to the 'decision' to rent the property are not claimable.

Since April 2016, you can claim for replacing furniture and white goods in a rented property – but not for the original furnishing of the property.

News from Westrop Medical Practice

There was much learned within general practice as a result of the pandemic, and not least the effectiveness of remote consultations as a way of providing medical care to patients without the need for travelling to the surgery. It is for this reason, therefore, that Westrop is excited to have started working alongside *Livi*, a private provider of GP video consultations.

This is very much an additional service – the same number of face-to-face GP appointments remain available to book should this be your chosen route. However, if you want to benefit from the convenience of seeing a doctor between the hours of 8am to 10pm, Monday to Friday, and 8am to 4pm, Saturday to Sunday, and you feel that your problem is one that would not need a physical examination, then *Livi* provides a great alternative to the existing options. Fully regulated by CQC, and last graded as 'outstanding' when inspected in 2021, *Livi* has a team of GPs that you can book in with at a time that is convenient for you. You simply download their app and follow the online instructions. The doctor will then contact you via their app at the agreed time.

The consultation is on video, hence the doctor is able to see you and carry out some basic examinations, for example looking at skin rashes. What's more they have full access to your medical records, can request blood tests and prescribe medication, and the notes they make will be visible for Westrop staff to see, helping with continuity for ongoing problems. If the GP feels that you do need a face-to-face appointment, this will be organised directly through the surgery in a timeframe that the clinician feels is appropriate. This service has been live now for several months and seems to be working really well. What's more, it is fully funded by the NHS and is therefore completely free to access, so why not consider this next time you need an appointment? More details can be found at www.livi.co.uk.

In other news, we are pleased to have taken over the running of Moredon surgery in January, growing the group to six surgeries and a total practice population of around 45,000. There is no change to clinician numbers working at Highworth, so patients won't notice any change in service as a result of the takeover.



Weigh It Up has arrived in Highworth





Weigh it Up (WiU) is the High Street's newest addition and the brainchild of local Matthew Aherne and his wife, Michelle. The couple have transformed the old betting shop opposite Highworth Travel into a refill and gift store with sustainability at its heart.

The store is a mix of the couple's passions: horticulture; food, and sustainability. Matt, who has recently left the RAF, said, 'When I was approaching the end of my service in the RAF, I wanted a new challenge. We hit upon the idea of starting our own business and were looking for something different that we believed in. We both love cooking and care about the environment, so it felt like a perfect idea – even though neither of us have done anything like this before. With the Betfred premises becoming vacant, we couldn't think of a more perfect location. After a lot of hard work by us, our friends and our family – all of whom have been so supportive – Highworth now has a refill shop.'

As you would expect from a store with a sustainability ethos, much of it has been equipped with recycled, repurposed, or secondhand things. All of the refill hoppers were bought secondhand, as were the scales, milk machines, and the furniture found in the shop.

Matt and Michelle want to encourage people to make even a small change to their weekly shop. With 75% of adults worried about climate change, they are encouraging everyone to help reduce their waste and make a difference. If everyone chooses to refill just one bottle or container it will have a huge collective impact.

So what can you expect to find in the shop? As the name suggests, a large proportion of the shop is devoted to the sale of loose goods, allowing you to buy just the amount you want, or need, for a

particular recipe which helps reduce both food and plastic waste, either by bringing in your own container or using one of the paper bags in store. There are also sauces, rubs, jams, pickles, plant pots, cards, and many more ever-changing items and gifts.

So what can you refill? There are a plethora of dried goods such as: pasta; rice; cereal; pulses; nuts; flour; dried fruits; herbs and spices; coffee; tea, and the ever-popular pick 'n' mix. There are also liquids, such as fresh organic whole milk, oat milk, oils and vinegars, as well as cleaning products for both you and your home. Most of the products have been chosen for their ethical or environmental credentials, companies such as Hedgy Socks who donate 10% of their profits to wildlife charities, and Sapling Spirits who are a climate-positive producer that plants a tree for every bottle sold.

When quizzed on their favourite areas there were clear winners for each. Matt said, 'Without a doubt, the specialist food area with weird and wonderfully different ingredients. By far our best seller must be the liquid herbs and anything hot; people love all the chilli sauces and oils.'

Michelle, however, is 'very proud of our UK-grown plants, all grown by Harriet's Plants. Harriet is an inspirational young woman who grows all of her houseplants, which are normally shipped in from abroad, in Staffordshire, in peat free compost using sustainable, chemical free practices.'

The shop is constantly evolving and hopefully WiU will be able to offer what Highworth and the surrounding villages want. If there is something you would like to see in the shop that isn't currently stocked, pop in and speak to Matt or Michelle. Like all local businesses, they can only keep going if you go into the shop and support them.

Our office is based at The Bridge Centre so we are able to work closely with volunteers here to provide holistic support, however the debt appointments are home visits for privacy and confidentiality. To make a free appointment simply call 0800 328 0006.

We also run CAP Job Club courses and CAP Lifeskills courses from The Bridge Centre. Both are eight-week friendly, community-based courses involving one-to-one coaching. The Job Club sessions cover motivation, strengths, CV writing, interview skills etc. whilst the Lifeskills sessions enable members to gain practical skills to lift the pressures that a low income and the rising cost of living bring. Finally, we have our own CAP Money coaches who run short, three-session, money management courses to help anyone find out where their money is going and gain better control of their budget.
