Time to Reach Out for More

A few weeks ago, late at night (I struggle with sleep), I was flicking through YouTube and I started watching something that caught my attention. It was a very normal looking church service in an American university in Kentucky. My response was not normal. As I watched, something in me rose up, like a deep longing or hushed up hope, and I found myself crying.

Six days before this at Asbury University, which sits on the edge of Wilmore,

Kentucky, a town half the size of Highworth, their regular hour-long Wednesday Chapel service started at 10am and, well, didn't stop. It ended up running non-stop for ten days. Ten days of worship, prayer, silence, confession.

testimony, and more worship.

Now for some of you, a tenday church service might sound like your idea of torture, but this was different. Led with zero hype, advertising or organisation, primarily led by young people, it was



pure, authentic and, dare I say, holy. Normal life stopped, and within hours crowds were descending upon this unknown university. It's estimated over 100,000 people visited the campus service over those ten days.

I cried because I saw a generation who have grown up in such an unstable world find stability. I cried because I saw young people who are normally caught in a whirlwind of social media, career and the ridiculous pace of society, stop. I cried

because I saw people genuinely loving and preferring one another in a generation that's all about 'me.' I cried because I saw Generation Zs finding meaning and value outside of themselves.



Today I pray that you too would be able to at least pause, find a little space, a moment to be, and remember what is of real value, and maybe even reach out for something more. I know I am already.

Didn't I tell you spring was just around the corner? And just like that – woomph! – it's here.


Spring always brings a sense of possibility. A fresh start. A clean slate. A hope for renewal. I read a quote the other day that goes like this:

Life Skills Manager, Eoli Pieri, says, 'With food prices soaring during the cost of living crisis, reducing our food waste is going to be good, both for our planet and our wallets. We've put together some of our top tips for saving money on your weekly shop.'

Make a plan

A lot of food waste comes from buying food without considering when and how we'll use it. Planning in advance what you're going to cook can ensure you only buy the ingredients you need. Why not have a look at our low cost recipes at www.capuk.org/recipes for some inspiration?

Make a list

Once you've planned your meals for the week, write down everything you need on a list.

Don't shop when hungry!

We've all been there. There's nothing in the house and you're hungry. You pop to the shops to stock up, and somehow end up buying far more snacks than you planned.

Understand the retail techniques that get you to buy more

Most shops have special offers, but not every special offer will save you money. Have you noticed that staple items like bread and milk are



often at the back of the shop, meaning you'll walk past aisles of other products on the way? However, there are some great savings that can be made by signing up for a loyalty programme, for example.

Get clever with leftovers

Even with the best planning in the world, you'll sometimes have leftover food. Before you throw it away why not see if you can still use it? Uneaten, overripe bananas are still perfect for mashing up to make banana bread or banana pancakes.

You can find more helpful ideas like this at our Life Skills groups which are all about making small healthy changes to live well on a careful budget. Our CAP Life Skills course is free and will run again at The Bridge Centre on Tuesdays starting 18 April from 1pm to 2:30pm for eight weeks.

Ask AMS Do I need to pay tax on rental income?

If you have net rental income on which you'll have tax to pay, (rent minus expenses) then you must register for a Self- Assessment tax return and keep a record of your rental income and 'allowable' expenses (you can find out what they are here www.gov.uk/renting-out-a-property/paying-tax). If the rent is lower than the personal allowance of

ftne rent is lower than the personal allowance of £12,570 -2022/23 (and you have no other income), you will not pay income tax. But if the gross rental income exceeds £10,000, or the net rental income exceeds £2,500, then HMRC will still require a tax return.

If you make a loss on the rental, it is still a good idea to complete a Tax Return so that you can record the loss, carry it forward, and maybe reduce your tax in a later year.



Each class is regularly read to by their class teacher and enthusiastic, confident and expressive reading is both encouraged and modelled frequently. There are many opportunities for children to read in school, including whole class guided reading, individual reading to a teacher, TA or class helper, as well as wider reading opportunities that occur through everyday classroom teaching, topic books and visits to our school library.



Michael 'Mike' Quick: 1934 – 2022



Mike Quick, who passed away on 20 November 2022, will be remembered by many for his involvement with several organisations in Highworth: As a founder member of the Rambling Club; a member of the Highworth Historical Society (later becoming Chairman); a Scout leader; a member of the Camera Club, and the Wine and Beer Circle.

He was born and raised in Bath

and, after leaving school, took on a variety

of jobs as a postman, a cabinet maker, and later at the Admiralty with Customs and Excise.

In December 1972, with the introduction of VAT, Mike became a VAT Inspector and the family moved


to Crane Furlong in Highworth where the couple stayed for the rest of their lives.

Whilst the member base and committee inevitably changed throughout the decades, Bob regularly appeared on race days to help out, say hi, and recollect on the prosperity of the club. It was, therefore, with great sadness that, in December last year, the club learnt that Bob had passed away. Our thoughts, of course, remain with his family, but his legacy can be seen in the town every Wednesday evening as discipulus enthusiasts pound the very same

roads and pavements as Bob all those years ago.




