Nobody is able to live a full life without others. You have gifts I don't have, and I have gifts you don't have. And so, coming together, we share for the best of all. As Tutu said, 'Interdependence is the very root of

# Christian Aid Week: Jen's Story

Jen, a loving mum in Malawi, dreams of her children being able to have the education they deserve. Her hard-working boys have earned places at top colleges, but Jen cannot afford to send them both. 'My heart longs to see our children finish school,' says Jen. 'These dreams are very important to me because, by doing so, I'll be sure that I am creating a good future for my children.'

Her two oldest boys have gained tertiary education places, which is very rare for young people from her rural area. One has a place at a prestigious polytechnic and one at a well-known college. Jen works hard to provide for her children, but soaring costs of food, fuel, fertiliser, school uniforms and school fees are crushing her dreams and keeping her family in poverty. Now Jen has had to make a choice, one no mum should be forced to make. Rising costs mean Jen can pay for only one of her son's college courses. Jen desperately needs to earn more so that her oldest son, Mathews, can study as well.

Jen and her husband have two acres of pigeon peas but are struggling with the effects of the climate crisis. The rainfall is unreliable and there are more storms, flooding and stronger winds. Malawi has been recently hit by a powerful cyclone lasting several days, causing widespread damage. Although the pigeon pea is a tough plant, able to withstand a lot – just like Jen – Jen needs to make the most of her crop by planting good quality seeds to sell the peas for the best price possible and not to unscrupulous middlemen.

During Christian Aid week your gift could help farmers like Jen plant better seeds, secure a fairer price for their crops and build happier futures for their children.

Please give and help this strong and determined mum provide for her family's future.

This is one example of Christian Aid's work to end world poverty.

### Charity Coffee Morning at Highworth Methodist Church

Julia lost her life to pancreatic cancer in 2022 at the age of just 56. Her journey since sudden diagnosis in 2021 reflects a

disease that is extremely difficult to detect in the early stages and has the lowest survival rate of any common cancer at just 7%. Despite these figures, pancreatic cancer receives only 3% of all cancer research funding.

Julia lived in Highworth from 1975, attending Warneford School until her gift for languages led her to live and work in France, Germany and Switzerland. Her Christian faith, nurtured in Highworth, meant she maintained links with many in the Highworth community and she drew upon it for the strength and courage needed through previous tragedy and in her recent illness.

Sue Hodgson and Elaine Rowe will be undertaking the challenging 177 mile Offa's Dyke national trail walk to raise much needed funds in memory of Julia. (Yes, it is the same Miss Hodgson who may have taught you or your children maths; and Elaine may have taught you to play the flute and to drive – maybe not at the same time!) The coffee morning will be an opportunity to find out more about their challenge and enjoy a drink and some homemade cake whilst adding to our fundraising efforts. Ask AMS
I earn less than £10,000 from selfemployment. Do I have to register for
anything?

Yes, is the short answer. You certainly must sign up for Self Assessment with HMRC if you earned more than £1,000 through self-employment. Once you register for Self Assessment, you will be given a Unique Taxpayer Reference number as proof that you are a self-employed taxpayer. You may also have to pay National Insurance contribution payments which will go towards state benefits and the state pension that you will receive in future years.

It is possible to be employed in a PAYE job and to also work as a sole trader and, even though you might pay tax through your job (PAYE), you will still need to register the 'trade' for Self Assessment and declare both sets of income to HMRC in a Self Assessment Income Tax Return.





My School Trip to Belgium Made Me Stop and Think

Three words to describe my time in Belgium with a group of Year 9 students: interesting, thought-provoking, and fascinating.

Whilst there our tour guide was Mr Twiggs, who has a deep understanding of WWI. If you asked him a question, I would put money on it that he would give you a definite and detailed answer. He was nothing short of a walking encyclopedia.

One of my favourite parts of the whole trip was our visit to Tyne Cot Cemetery which is the largest British military cemetery in the world. It was truly mind-blowing and riveting. The 12,000 men who are named and the 35,000 men who are unknown, all lying there. On Tuesday evening we attended the Last Post at Menin Gate where two buglers played the traditional tribute to honour the memory of all who perished in the First World War.

It truly was a once in a lifetime experience that I will never forget.

### Hilliers - 100th Anniversary

2023 marks our 100th anniversary; the first funeral dates back to May 1923 and Hillier Funeral Service has remained a family run company, now in its 4th generation. The company was originally set up by Harold Hillier. After a short time spent working at Great Western Railway he established a building company at The Broadway, Rodbourne Cheney; it was in the days when homes fit for heroes had been promised by the government for the brave souls who had survived the horrors of the war. Harold did his bit and the company grew to a workforce of 60 men who built many houses in the area. But a black cloud lay on the horizon. The depression days arrived and contracts dried up. He turned his hand to funerals and ran both businesses for a time.

Due to the growing town an office was set up in a house in Victoria Road. The workshops, garage and chapel of rest stayed at the Broadway. Coffins were prepared by hand from butts of oak and elm that were delivered to the workshop. There they were sawn and planed by hand and made into coffins. Local artists engraved the name plates. The first motor hearse was bought in 1933, before this funerals were conducted with a hand bier.

Harold's son Michael joined the business in 1944 and took control of the business when Harold retired in 1952. Michael, now aged 96, still takes a keen interest in the business and still conducts the occasional funeral. Michael's son Mark joined the business in 1980, building on the family tradition of providing a professional caring service. He moved the main office from 55 Victoria Road to 170 Victoria Road in 1993,

established our unique Bereavement Care service and extended and modernised the chapels at The Broadway.

In 2014 Rebecca, Mark's daughter, joined the business. Looking at the forever changing funeral industry the business has adapted the ways of working to best suit

the needs of their clients and constantly looks to improve their services. One thing that has remained constant throughout the 100 years is the service we provide to families which has made us a firmly established and integral part of the community. In the last five years we have opened our Highworth branch and moved our head office to Kingshill House in Old Town, as well as making improvements to our website, internal systems, products and the services we offer.

To mark our centenary, we decided to give something back to the people of Swindon. Therefore we will be setting up 'The Hillier Community Fund' which aims to support local charities. More information about this will be available on our website at the end of May.

We are looking forward to serving Swindon and the surrounding areas for the next 100 years.






