Life is full of decisions. Some are really big, like 'Do I get married?', 'What career do I choose?' or 'Who am I?'. Some are, on the other hand, really easy, like 'Do I order extra fries?'. However, some of the hardest ones are the ones you don't anticipate being a problem at all.

Let me talk about crockery. We have very recently moved house and were standing in IKEA getting some new plates, bowls etc.

This, I think, is our fifth set in nearly 25 years of marriage and, whilst we are not given to Greek weddings or domestics, each set had experienced chips, cracks and breakages to the point where we no longer had enough of the one set to lay the table uniformly. Our recurring mistake has been, we realised, not getting enough of one set to cope with loss. A set of 32, it would seem, has a lifespan of roughly six years. So I began loading the trolley with our chosen design and I went big – grabbing three packs of four dinner plates, side plates, bowls, dessert bowls and pasta bowls. Moving onto the cushions and throws area, doubt hit me: Perhaps I need more? So I stopped, turned back, and added another pack of four of each. Feeling pleased that our dining future was secure I moved on, only for fresh doubts to erupt: What if the dishwasher hasn't



finished? What if we hold a big celebration? And isn't some crockery used more often than others? I returned to the kitchenware department.

Insurance is a funny thing. The point is to make us feel secure safe and ready to meet the swings and roundabouts of life, yet it is often driven by fear and we never really know how much is enough. Whether it's having enough dinner plates, medical

cover, or reserves in the bank, am I safe? Will everything be ok? Psalm 18 (found roughly in the middle of the Bible) says, 'The LORD is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the strength of my salvation, my stronghold.' We are in days of great turmoil and this reality, Jesus being my rock, has been, and is, life-changing for me. Despite moments of crockery weakness I know I am safe and secure because He will never change. He is always there. He will never leave me. It's not mere insurance but my purpose, my hope, my rest, and my future.

By the way, we are now looking for more storage solutions.

Ask AMS

Changing from a sole trader to a Limited Company

Transferring from a sole-trader or partnership, to a Limited Company is sometimes recommended by accountants for tax planning reasons or to benefit from Limited Liability and they will consider the following issues.

When: Work out which side of a tax year end to transfer the business because this decision will affect taxable income (and rates) between tax years.

Documents: A Company is a separate legal entity, this needs to be reflected in all legal documents including invoices, contracts, your website and any insurance policies.

Capital Gains Tax and hold-over elections (s.162/s.165 elections):

Transfer of a business can result in Capital Gains Tax. Valuation of assets (particularly 'goodwill') may be necessary and 'hold-over elections' considered and, if necessary, submitted to HMRC in order to reduce/postpone Capital gains Tax.

Eco Tip from Weigh It Up

The average person in the UK uses 152 litres of water a day. By using water more wisely we can ease the pressure on the natural environment, especially in times of drought, and save energy. Making small changes, like turning off the tap when you are brushing your teeth (the average person uses six to nine litres of water a day brushing their teeth) or living by the saying 'if it's yellow let it mellow; if it's brown flush it down', can make a big difference to your water usage, helping the wildlife which depend on water in the environment for their survival.

Cooking Eco Tip: Switch from boiling your vegetables to steaming them. When you steam vegetables you use less water and you keep more nutrients in your vegetables whilst also saving money and energy.

Up and coming events include a bric-a-brac sale, a book sale (fiction only), and an adult clothes exchange. Please visit our website or Facebook page where you will find further details.



The Peaky Climbers Stride to Save Avaya

Eight ladies from Honeys Bootcamp – a bootcamp set up two years ago in Blunsdon Village – will be taking on the National Three Peaks Challenge on 22 and 23 July, and they need your help.

Avaya is eight years old and has been battling Neuroblastoma, a rare but aggressive childhood cancer, for three years. In that short time she has

> endured so much treatment. clinical trials, radiotherapy,

> > radiation treatment, and 22 cycles of toxic chemo. but the tumour is still present and hasn't shrunk since the first lot of treatments Avaya had in 2020. It is also wrapped around two maior blood vessels.

The doctors, surgeons, and Neuroblastoma team have given Avaya the ability to live as normal a life as she can (going to school, dancing, playing with her friends, and enjoying life) without having to think about the next time she needs to visit the hospital, lose her hair, or endure the pain that she has encountered over the last few years. Avaya's tumour is not shrinking but to remove the tumour would be far too risky as Avaya may suffer life-changing problems which is not justifiable at present. Avaya and her family try to live life to the full: however



Avaya still has to go to hospital every three months for scans and assessment, and a lifesaving operation to have the tumour removed privately (at a cost of over £250,000, which is far greater than the family's means) is not a realistic prospect.

Avaya's family, medical team, friends and supporters who have fought to help save this little girl have given her hope and a light at the end of the tunnel. However, until Avaya's tumour is removed, that bell can't be rung.

Group organiser Rhae McCartney said, 'Honeys Bootcamp was set up in the village two years ago to bring together women through the fun of exercising and the group has grown from strength to strength. Training twice a week, 30 ladies support each other through everything and the eight of us taking on this monstrous challenge know the group, and our friends and families, will be right behind us.'

On 13 May, a coffee morning was held at the Methodist Church which raised over £1600. We are so grateful to everyone who helped, those who donated the delicious cakes, for all the

fantastic items made for the craft stall and for everyone who came along and donated so generously. It was lovely to see many who had known Julia from when she lived in Highworth and attended Warneford School and some family who had come up especially from Cornwall. We were overwhelmed by the response as we know resources are very stretched for some at the minute and there are so many other good causes also requiring our attention.

Because this article had to be submitted by the first of June, at the time of writing we haven't yet



set off on our marathon trek. However, by the time you read this we will hopefully be well along the way. It is going to be quite a challenge for us two women who may be in our prime but are definitely not in our youth!

Julia lost her life to Pancreatic Cancer on 3 June 2022 at the age of just 56. Her



tortuous journey since sudden diagnosis reflects a disease that is extremely difficult to detect in its early stages and has the lowest survival rate of any common cancer at just 7%. Despite this, it only receives 3% of all cancer research funding.





The police did such a wonderful job too – so many forces coming together to keep us all safe – lining the Mall every six feet or so, keeping a straight face no matter how much we tried to distract them.

We all stood in silence as we listened to the service at Westminster Abbey and joined in when we could; somehow the heavy rain didn't really make a difference. Then the moment we had all been waiting for; the King and Queen passing by in the Golden State Coach. It's simply breathtaking and unbelievable to think the carriage is 260 years old!

Later we gathered on the Mall to watch the Red Arrows overhead, a moment we will never forget even though the flypast was slimmed down due to the bad weather. The day was topped off when the beautiful Anita Rani, who happened to be filming on the Mall at that time, made a beeline for Malcolm to ask him about his day. Star struck or what!

She was extremely proud when it was finally opened. She had a wide range of interests and was variously a member of the WI, HT Netball Club, a walking group, and a quiz team. She was very sociable, meeting up with former teaching colleagues and an extensive network of friends.

Her family say that Pam suffered from FOMO (Fear Of Missing Out) but it was more of a case of being widely interested and supportive of a range of people. She did all this despite having Type 1 diabetes and she never let this condition define or restrict her.

Pam will be sadly missed by her family and friends. Her life benefited everyone.

Highworth Artists' Society: Did you know?

- Highworth Artists' Society began in the 1960s when three artists, who wanted to paint together, decided to form a painting group.
- BOSHOUTS MITSTY SOCIETY
- An open exhibition in February 1969 in the Wild Oats Café in the High Street (now Salam's Restaurant) triggered the formation of the Society and the inaugural meeting was held in March of that year.
- By 1990 the Society was meeting for two hours a week in the Council Offices in Gilberts Lane. Exhibitions were held in the Saracen's Head pub, still a regular haunt for some of our members on a Tuesday lunchtime!
- Since 2013 we have shown over 2000 paintings and welcomed over 10,600 visitors to the exhibitions, many of whom are returning supporters.
- Although art used to be an Olympic event, only 20 minutes of creativity a day is said to improve our mental health by relieving stress, improving memory, and slowing cognitive decline.
- Whilst up to 60 minutes of brush mileage a day can radically improve technique, 10,000 hours is generally accepted as being the number of hours to become a master. A very good reason to join us and start getting the miles in!
- In 1706 the colour wheel was invented by Isaac Newton, who refracted sunlight into six colours. The Hundred of Worth, or Highworth as it became known, had been in existence before 1300 so predates one of the greats!


