On 10 January, Year 6 members of Westrop's school council took part in an incredible opportunity to visit the Houses of Parliament. After travelling down to London and looking out for landmarks, we were given a tour of Parliament which included getting to watch a live debate in the Houses of Commons. The children really enjoyed seeing some of the MPs in action and learning about the bobbing action that takes place if they want to speak.

After our fascinating tour, we had a 'People's Parliament' where we debated our views on everything from eating vegetables to children running the world! During this workshop, we were surprised by our local MP, Justin Tomlinson, who was in Parliament at the time and stopped by to answer all of our questions about government, life as an MP and how to use our voice about issues that concern us. We are very grateful that he paid us a visit and it really allowed the children to be able to put a face to the different roles within government.

The children were an absolute credit to Westrop throughout the entire trip. They listened carefully to the guides, asked thoughtful questions of our MP, and we could not be prouder of them.



This spring we're encouraging everyone in Highworth and the surrounding areas to use our free tools to create for themselves a personal budget and follow our five simple steps to improve their finances in 2024.

1. Create a personal budget

A personal budget can be the key that unlocks the knowledge you need about your personal finances that you can then use to make positive changes. Download and print off CAP's budgeting guide at www.capuk.org/budgeting to create your own personal budget.

2. Balance your budget

See if your budget balances, which means to check you aren't spending more money than you have coming in. Consider cutting costs by finding a cheaper alternative or think about what non-essentials you can cut completely to help you try and avoid living in your overdraft or falling into debt.

3. Maximise your income

The third step is to make sure you are maximising your income. Even if you're in work, it's always worth checking if you're missing out

on any benefits income that you are entitled to.


4. Seek free debt help

Highworth Historical Society Celebrates Women's Day

International Women's Day will be held on 8 March and, to celebrate, our talk on 27 March is entitled 'Extraordinary Wiltshire Women'.

Ruth Butler from the Record Centre in Chippenham is our speaker. Ruth will speak about women who range from the humble to the wealthy, from the Middle Ages to modern times. Included are Maud Heath, whose name may be familiar to walkers in the county. Also Lady Arundell who held Wardour Castle in the Civil War. They all seem to have defied the traditional view of women at their time in history.

Upper Thames and Ridgeway National Trust Association

Andrew Beer, a former pupil of Warneford School and now the Director of Operations and Consultancy for the National Trust, started off the 2024 talks in great style. No revenue funding is available from the government for the 30,000 buildings and 250,000 hectares of land cared for by the National Trust. Andrew spoke about the need to look back, as well as forward, when planning repairs, maintenance and conservation of properties. Greater use of electronic communication will save costs on printed matter.

The Trust values its staff, which has a high percentage of younger people, and the many thousands of volunteers of all ages. There are now large numbers of families who are members of the National Trust in response to changes in attitudes and the provision of greater facilities. Three projects were used to illustrate the challenges facing the Trust.

The first concerned land management and the conflict of interest in the Lake District at Goldrill Beck, that is flood prevention, tourism, land management and its position in the National Park, and as a UNESCO site. After much debate, a solution was reached to enable

the tenant farmer to graze stock on part of the site and the river to be diverted to prevent flooding in its lower courses. An extra bonus is that otters moved in and wildlife flourished.

The second was the decision to be made about Clandon Park, decimated by fire. Should it be restored, rebuilt or demolished? After wide consultation the decision has been made to partially restore it and to develop the remainder as a multipurpose site.

Thirdly, Andrew dealt with the subject of tree replacement and land management at the Sherborne estate. The types of trees to be planted must be suitable for the present environment and also for the future which we face with climate change.

Future talks will be on 11 March, 18 April and the annual holiday is 15 to 19 June.

Having been open just over a year, The Hub is changing and evolving all the time to best suit the needs of the community. We have enlarged our refill station to include washing detergent, fabric softener, all-purpose cleaner, hand wash and washing-up liquid. Bring your own container or buy one for a small cost which you can then re-use



We have signed-up to becoming part of the Plastic Free Communities scheme and are hoping to involve local businesses, the parish council, and schools. Whilst we cannot eliminate plastic completely from our lives, we can work towards drastically reducing it. Sign up for the Big Plastic Count, which runs from 11 to 17 March, at www.thebigplasticcount.com to receive your pack and then record all the different types of plastic packaging waste you use during that week.

We are working with the Defence Academy to provide a community compost heap. The DA produces more compost than it can use and it has offered the surplus to local people. Watch this space for updates. Due to the popularity of the book swap we held last November, we now have a dedicated room full of books where you can either bring a book and take a book, or buy a paperback for 50p and a hardback for £1. There are also jigsaws to purchase for £1.50, or you can swap jigsaws in the phone box on the corner of the Highworth Road and Stallpits Road.

We have enlarged both our adult clothing sale area and children's corner. The Craft Scrap Store is a magnet for crafters and would-be crafters, for both adults and children. Here you will find everything from knitting wool and patterns, card-making supplies, buttons, beads, material, stationery, etc..

The Resurrection of Jesus

It's not uncommon to have a main character in a film, novel or soap opera dying and coming back to life. In a world of zombie movies and cryonics coming back to life is not far from our imagination. In chapter 20 of the Gospel of John we hear the account of the resurrection of Jesus from two women visiting the tomb early in the morning. The miracle of the resurrection is one of the core doctrines of the Christian faith. But why does it matter that Jesus rose from the dead? And will we also be resurrected?

In many books and films, the protagonist dies and then comes back to life. Can you think of some examples? Neo in 'The Matrix', Gandalf in 'Lord of the Rings Two Towers', Aslan in 'The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe', and Harry Potter in 'The Deathly Hallows'.

In thinking about Easter we need to ask ourselves these questions: What is accomplished by Jesus dying – is it a great sacrifice or a great injustice? How does He live again? Is it a gift or a product of His own power?

I often reflect on how technology issues can be solved by a restart – closing down the computer and then restarting it again. Maybe this can shed some light on God's plan of resurrection. A way for us to start again. A seed is buried in the ground and springs up to new life – reborn. So we are offered new life as we surrender our lives to God. As He brought Jesus out of the tomb on Easter morning, He also brings us to new life. The mistakes and sins of the past are dead, and we have new life in and with Jesus.





Highworth URC Writes for Rights Again

Before Christmas, the members of the URC sat down after morning service and signed cards of good wishes to eight men and women selected by Amnesty UK from their sadly bulging files as needing support under duress or imprisonment.

They ranged across the world: a mother seeking justice in Brazil; murder in Eswatini (the old Swaziland); Kyrgyzstan; Myanmar; Poland; 25 years on death row in Alabama USA; Tunisia, and a decade of prison in Abu Dhabi. A small deed in what is often a dark world, cumulatively these cards can build to many thousands and each year Amnesty International is able to record successes in gaining relief.

Did You Know That March Is Cerebral Palsy Awareness Month?

My sister has Cerebral Palsy, but I never really knew what it was. I would like to share some information about this condition as I feel it is important to raise awareness of this motor disability.

So what is Cerebral Palsy (also known as CP)?

Cerebral Palsy affects approximately one in every 400 children born in the UK, but no two people experience it in the same way. It is a lifelong condition affecting movement and coordination. CP is damage or abnormal development to the brain that is caused during pregnancy, birth or soon after. There is no cure for CP and people can be affected from severe to mild.

There are four types of Cerebral Palsy:

Spastic – tightened muscles (which makes it hard to move) and joint stiffness.

Dyskinetic – difficulty controlling limbs and muscles which may affect speech and language.

Ataxic – difficulty with balance, coordination and spatial awareness. This can also affect speech and language.

Mixed - There are a small number of children with CP that will have more than one form of the condition.

Cerebral Palsy affects different parts of the body:

Monoplegia – affects one limb, usually an arm.

Hemiplegia – affects one side of the body, legs, arms and torso.

Quadriplegia - affects all four limbs.

Pipligla – affects symmetrical parts of the body, legs or arms.

I hope you have found this information interesting and share it with a friend or your children sometime this month. There is a lot of information online if you want to know more and some good illustrations which helped me and my siblings to understand Cerebral Palsy better.




Swindon Croquet Club

Tuesday between 8am and 11am, surplus food from local supermarkets and other donors is on display for you to help yourself. They are also asking allotment holders to donate their surplus produce. The Larder relies on volunteers to source the food, collect it, and display it. If you have not visited as yet, go along one Tuesday morning and sample the goods. A big thank you to the creators of the scheme and a big thank you also to all those who have contributed in any way.

Good news. Thanks to the British Heart Foundation, Highworth recently took ownership of a new defibrillator. This one is destined for the telephone box at the top of Grove Hill. There were several conditions attached, one of which was offering training on CPR to the residents. Coincidentally, a few days after delivery of the defibrillator a new BHF fundraising manager was appointed for Oxfordshire and Wiltshire; I wasted no time in meeting her and she has agreed to lead the training. I know many of you are reluctant to use a defibrillator because you do not understand how it works, so she will demystify it for you and assure you that you can do no harm. Training is not difficult - all you need is a firm cushion and a smartphone. We still fall behind other countries in saving people who have had a cardiac arrest outside of the hospital. For example, Britain has a 10% success rate, Denmark 50%.

Finally, more good news. The Town Council is creeping ever closer to installing the first of three new play areas!




