

#### **Peace**

We live in a world plagued with incredible stress and turmoil in every facet of life. From billionaires to paupers, none among Adam's progeny is immune to the circumstances that tear at our vitals.

Over and above the turbulence of all that threatens our peace, however, we hear the voice of one echoing through the centuries: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27)

The dictionary defines peace as 'freedom from disturbance'. In the Holy Scriptures, however, the Hebrew word translated 'peace' means completeness, soundness and welfare. The Greek word for 'peace' means rest, wholeness, welfare. The peace that Christ proffers to all who trust in Him is wholly independent of any external factors contending with us. His peace is described as 'the peace that surpasses understanding' (Philippians 4:7). It is wholly supernatural and heavenly

and overrides everything that contends with us.

Christ solves our problems, not primarily by changing our environments, but by changing us inwardly. He puts in us an attitude of focusing on Him, seeing His mercy, love, and sovereignty. Like David who



mocked and slew Goliath because his focus was on God rather than the terrifying bully giant, so we, focusing on Christ, will always draw divine power to make us more than conquerors.

'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.' (Philippians 4:6-7)

#### **Four Nurses Climb Three Peaks**

Four nurses from the Urgent Treatment Centre at the Great Western Hospital are about to embark on the biggest physical challenge they have ever known.

On 5 July they, along with a few friends and family, are going to attempt the 23 gruelling miles of the National Three Peaks 24-hours Challenge in support of Jennifer Chappell and her husband whose daughter, Olivia, became critically ill in November 2023.

#### Jennifer explains:

"In November 2023 our lives were changed forever. Our beloved five-month-old daughter became critically ill with the common respiratory illness RSV for the second time since her birth. The first time she was unwell, CPAP (Continuous Positive Airway Pressure – apparatus to support a baby's breathing) was started quickly and it prevented her from being ventilated and saved her life in a matter of days.

"She was not so lucky the second time around. A shortage of CPAP machines available meant she was

left with a hands-off approach to see if she could survive on her own. This left her in a very critical condition. No doctor was available that night to intubate her due to the number of poorly babies in the unit. In desperation, and in an attempt to save her life, the nurses looking after Olivia borrowed a CPAP machine being used on another baby. Both babies survived, thankfully. Had there been enough CPAP machines available that day Olivia's condition would not have deteriorated as it did and nurses would have been spared this awful dilemma.

"As parents we could not bear the thought of this happening to another child or family and wish to raise money by completing the Three Peaks Challenge this summer to purchase more CPAP machines or Optiflow devices for the GWH Children's Unit. These will aid the battle against the increasing number of respiratory illnesses that have proven to be fatal to those most vulnerable."

All money raised from the challenge will be donated to the Children's Unit at the Great
Western Hospital. If you feel able to

#### **Ask AMS**

Do I need to pay tax on rental income?

If you have net rental income on which you'll have tax to pay, (rent minus expenses) then you must register for a Self-Assessment tax return and keep a record of your rental income and 'allowable' expenses (you can find out what they are here <a href="https://www.gov.uk/renting-out-a-property/paying-tax">www.gov.uk/renting-out-a-property/paying-tax</a>).

If the rent is lower than the personal allowance of £12,570 -2024/25 (and you have no other income), you will not pay income tax. But if the gross rental income exceeds £10,000, or the net rental income exceeds £2,500, then HMRC will still require a tax return. If you make a loss on the rental, it is still a good idea to complete a Tax Return so that you can record the loss, carry it forward, and maybe reduce your tax in a later year.

- Empty beauty product containers. (Only containers that do not have the 'widely recycled' symbol. These can go in your green bin.)

To help us make sure we only send the correct items, please hand to a member of staff for checking. Please

note this recycling scheme is only for individuals and residential households.

The success of The Hub so far has enabled Sustainable Shrivenham to fund this scheme but donations, when possible, are very welcome as they will allow us to continue to provide and maybe extend this service to the community.

In further good news, we are now also able to fund the Blister Pack Recycling Scheme so there will no longer be a charge to our customers. As always, a small donation if and when you can will help to keep it going.

We have also been working hard to make our recycling drop off as simple as possible to use and the space now includes information of many local recycling schemes and where you can access them. On Wednesday 26 June we welcome Michael Gilbert, renowned speaker and London guide, for his illustrated talk on London 1851 and the Great Exhibition.

The Great Exhibition of 1851 was probably the most successful, memorable and influential cultural event of the 19th century. With Prince Albert's energetic patronage and Joseph Paxton's gigantic pre-fabricated building of iron and glass, Hyde Park was, from May to October 1851, filled with over six million visitors who were able to view over 100,000 exhibits. When it closed it had generated a vast profit of £186,000; approximately £24.5 million today.

For those new to the town we meet at St Michael's Hall on Lechlade Road. The doors open at 7pm and the talk starts at 7:30pm. Visitors are always welcome for a charge of £3 – cash only please.

#### **Warneford Fundraising Success for SDASS**

Music is a big thing at the school. We hold two or three gigs a term as well as a big annual concert and most of our performances have a charity attached to them. #### The Well at Watchfield (and Shrivenham!)

This title will be familiar to those in the villages mentioned, and I am grateful to now introduce the Highworth area to the work of The Well.

We have quite a large armed services community in the Vale serving, retired, and families too. Amongst that community are those who have been badly affected by armed conflict; that damage might include bereavement, physical wounding or mental health issues. Armed Forces medical and welfare services, the NHS and service charities all contribute to tackling this familiar and widespread aftermath of war – their tireless service is warmly acknowledged. The Well simply complements their work.

These organisations focus on their own areas of expertise, whether it's Help for Heroes, an army



physiotherapist, an NHS surgeon, Combat Stress or a community psychiatric nurse. They mostly concentrate on the healing of war wounds inflicted on both bodies and minds. Whilst combat trauma, PTSD and moral injury are widely regarded as problems of mental illhealth, The Well is a resource for understanding, refreshing and renewing wounded spirits.

The rationale is based on the fact that we all have a spirit. Our spirit appreciates art, beauty, love and creation, and includes our unique conscience – our innate ability to sense right from wrong. It is not only so-called religious people who talk about spirit and The Well is not directly connected to church; in fact, we are currently meeting in a pub! We are not a charity, an organisation or a website. We are just a regular gathering of like-minded people who have some armed forces connections... and wounded spirits which need a degree of healing. The warmth, camaraderie, understanding and banter of this militarily-savvy, well-qualified group has already proved its worth.


Each class is 30 mins and is the usual price of £15 with sibling discount for additional children booked.




