Help Your Children to Get a Healthy Start in Life

Swindon Borough Council is currently encouraging parents of children aged four and under and expectant mums over 10 weeks to check and see if they are eligible for a Healthy Start Card on the NHS.



Get help to buy food and milk with the NHS Healthy Start scheme.

Check if you're eligible and apply online at www.healthystart.nhs.ul

Families who are eligible and apply will be sent a prepaid Healthy Start card which can be used to help buy a variety of healthy foods including milk, fruit, vegetables and pulses. The card is topped up automatically every four weeks during the time they are eligible. The card can also be used to collect free Healthy Start vitamins for mums to take during pregnancy and while they are breastfeeding, as well as free vitamin drops for babies and young children up to four years of age.

Residents in Highworth can collect their vitamins from The Bridge Centre, 8 Sheep Street, Monday to Friday, 11am to 1pm. The friendly team there are also happy to help families apply for their Healthy Start Card online. Feel free to call in during the week while the Centre is open. 
Delight for Highworth Community Larder

Every Cloud Says 'Cheese!'



Get Active with Swindon u3a!

If you want to keep active by taking up a sport or pursuit with like-minded people, the u3a could be for you. The u3a, an organisation run by and for people no longer in full time employment, has over 130 different groups, several of which cater for physical games and activities.

You can improve your skills, ability and wellbeing by joining one of our two badminton groups. Here you will play mainly as mixed doubles. They are mildly competitive to accommodate people of different abilities. A reasonable level of hand/eye coordination and some previous racquet sport experience is useful.

Our eight pétanque groups provide friendly, but not too competitive, games suitable for beginners to expert players. We also have a short mat bowls group which you may enjoy.

The three table tennis groups cater for players of all abilities in a friendly and supportive atmosphere. We would be pleased to advise which group would best suit you.

Ask AMS

What is a director's loan account?

Many directors/shareholders borrow money from their Companies but, as long as they repay it within 9 months of their following accounting year end date, there are no great tax implications.

If it is not repaid by that deadline, a law called s.455, says the Company must pay 33.75% (from April 2022) of the outstanding loan to HMRC – who will hold this money until the loan has been repaid to their Company in full.

What you cannot do is pay it back by the deadline and then re-borrow it soon afterwards *unless* the loan is under £15,000 where it could be re-borrowed after 30 days.

If you re-borrow more than £15,000, HMRC can make the decision that you always intended to re-borrow it later and apply the s.455 law as above. So, in practice you can borrow money from your Company – but be aware of the rules.

A Discovery That Transformed My Summer

About this time in September, teachers often set a writing task to re-engage young minds in the pursuit of education: 'What did you do over the summer holidays?'. For some there are fond memories of exhilarating adventures but, for many, it's been a long and boring break. What about you? How was your summer?

This summer I found my feet; correction, discovered my feet. A body part to which I'd hitherto paid scant attention. Why now? What's the big deal?

I'd been thinking about cycles in the spring and learned (from Dr Google) that, if I live to 80, my heart will have beatEN about 2.5 billion times. My lungs will have breathed about 700 million breaths. But we rarely give a thought to these hard-working organs.

Over my life, my feet will have done about 200 million steps. And did I care? No, just kept going! Until ... I started having pains in my feet that got so severe I felt I'd soon be immobile. Of course I'd heard about podiatrists; you know, the people who cut your nails when you get old and can't reach down that far.

I'll be forever grateful to Tracy, the podiatrist at the Faringdon Clinic, who introduced me to my feet. She showed me that my pain could be easily relieved, but not before she observed that I have one foot that tends to point outwards. Over the years, this had affected the structure of my foot and had eventually caused the pain. I'm now gradually correcting this with simple ankle rising exercises and nifty contoured insoles called Interpods, which fit neatly inside my shoes.

(Look away now if you don't like scalpels.)

But there was more to the pain. I'd developed a corn due to rubbing caused by my misaligned foot. Tracy referred me to her colleague Helen, who performed minor surgery to dig out the corn. Within minutes (and a few winces) the annoying pain had miraculously disappeared. Bingo!

So don't wait until foot pain strikes. See a podiatrist for a foot health assessment. Prepare to be amazed by what you learn about your feet.



The group is run and staffed by volunteers who all come from childcare backgrounds. Utilising the skills and experience of our committed volunteers allows us to offer places to expectant mothers and parents of new babies at a very low cost.

We are always looking to strengthen our pool of volunteers and are currently recruiting. We provide any necessary training and also pay for DBS checks. You don't have to be from a child development or educational background; it takes all sorts of skills to deliver our services.

Highworth Climate Talks Can Petrol Heads be Green?

October's Highworth Climate Talk will take place on 15 October in the Highworth Methodist Church, Vicarage Lane, Highworth SN6 7AD. Doors open at 7pm for free refreshments, talk starts at 7:30pm. We look forward to seeing you there.

We are very pleased to be able to welcome Dr Mark Dibben who is a retired academic, a former Head of the School of Management, Deputy Chair of the Senate at the University of Tasmania and a Distinguished Fellow of the Schumacher Institute in Bristol; one of the country's leading climate change policy think tanks (https://schumacherinstitute.org.uk/).

As an academic he was known for applied philosophy, particularly as applied to topics in management. This led him to ponder the role management has played in the climate crisis and what a (changed) approach to management could do to get us out of it. With this in mind, and bearing in mind a love of vintage cars, in retirement back home in the UK he is the architect of the sustainability strategies of the Vintage Sports Car Club, a small- to medium-sized enterprise called Vintage Bentley, and (with Steve Dymoke) the Bugatti Owners Club.

In the light of this experience, what he will be hoping to show in the talk is how we as individuals, and also how businesses as well as clubs, can do more to make a positive difference to the natural environment despite, or indeed directly as a result of, the reality of our needing to drive. That one does not require an electric car to make even a 'nature-positive' difference and also that it really is nowhere near as expensive as one might imagine.

New Job Club Course Launching

Our ever-popular calendar is currently in production and will be available mid-October. If you would like to



Diamond Anniversary of the Highworth Methodist Church

In November 1964 a crowd of people gathered on the corner of Vicarage Lane and Lechlade Road to celebrate the opening of a new church building. There were several churches in our lovely town where services of worship were held each week and two of them were Methodists; there have been Methodists here since 1838.

One group of Methodists met in a building in The Elms, opposite where The Rec centre now is, and

the other in a building a good way down the Lechlade Road. The two groups of people knew each other well and in the 1950s they met together and decided to look for a place where they could build a new, bigger Methodist church building. Lots of meetings, lots of letters, lots of prayer, lots of sacrificial giving, hard work and some grants, enabled their hopes and dreams to come true.

It was in November 1964 that the work was completed and the new building on the corner of Vicarage Lane and Lechlade Road was opened. The two congregations blended together with great certainty that this was God's way forward for the Methodists in Highworth This was a huge undertaking and walk of faith for those dear folk who saw their faith realised. their work completed and the building opened. The Elms chapel was sold and became the Silver Threads Hall: the Lechlade Road Hall sold to become the home for Highworth Silver Band and both buildings continued as integral parts of life in Highworth.

So this year is a very special one for the Highworth Methodist church family. We will celebrate it with special services on **Sunday 17 November**, with Rev. Paul Ashby and his wife Carmel returning to lead the services and share in our celebration, and we will 'praise God for all that is past and trust Him for all that's to come.'

Anthony Peers is a freelance historic buildings consultant, educated as an Architectural Historian at Manchester University and trained in building conservation at the Institute of Advanced Architectural Studies, York.




Shrivenham Park Golf Club


