FIRST THOUGHTS

There is Hope

Down through the centuries many services which are seen as fundamental to the life of our society were established by Christians. Many schools were founded by Christians, as were hospitals. Children's homes were first started by Christians such as Dr. Barnardo and the movement to abolish slavery was led by another Christian William Wilberforce. In recent years it was churches which led the way in setting up foodbanks to meet the needs of people whose incomes do not allow them to eat well.

In 1996, John Kirkby established Christians Against Poverty (CAP). He believed God was calling him to sacrifice his career in finance and use his knowledge of the industry to help those in need. He himself had become bankrupt and had a desire to assist people in recovering from the burden of debt, much of which was not due to their own inadequacies but to a range of circumstances.

As a result of John's initiative, CAP has spread throughout the UK and internationally. For nearly 11 years, Highworth has been blessed to have its own



CAP Debt Centre.

So, what motivates the CAP team? In the Old Testament in the book of Micah, the question is asked "What does the Lord require of you?" The answer comes "To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

Jesus, when He was on earth, stated that His mission was "to proclaim good news to the poor, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom to the captives and release from darkness for

the prisoners and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour." (Luke chapter 4 verse 18)

As churches we seek through CAP to carry out this Jesus manifesto. Our motivation comes out of the love of Jesus for each individual. This love is non-judgmental. It is shown to all of our clients regardless of background. Already several hundred people in the Highworth area have experienced the love which brings hope and transforms their lives. Our message to people is – there is hope!

Ask AMS

Can I claim expenses for working from home for my business?

Business owners can claim the expense of using their home as an office, based on the portion of rent, mortgage interest, council tax, water, fuel etc. used while working on the business at home. There are 2 ways to calculate this:

Weekly Claim: Business owners spending small amounts of time, say, invoicing or doing minimal work relating to the business can claim £6 per week (or £26/month) without calculating the actual home expenses used.

Actual Expenses: If the owner spends, say, a few hours each day at home running the business, they can claim a proportion of actual home expenses. (Rent. rates etc. as above)

If you want to use the second method, HMRC provide examples online – but they are complex. I recommend that you ask your accountant to do the calculation.



Go and Do Likewise

Highworth resident and author Keith Holder has written a follow-up to his first book 'When Did We See You?', which sold over 250 copies in ten countries and received many positive reviews. His new book, 'Go and Do Likewise', is a sequel written from a slightly different angle.

Both books describe life in the shanty towns of Costa Rica, Central America and how the Educación Plus charity, founded by him and his wife Joy 30 years ago, continues to work there. They try to follow Jesus' example by offering spiritual, emotional and material support to those living in such extreme conditions.

Keith says, "It's been deeply moving at times; often enjoyable and sometimes quite dangerous. We've shared their joys and sorrows as they live – and die – side-by-side with gun-toting drug dealers and the literal murder and mayhem pushed by them. But we've always been aware of God's guidance, protection and provision."

But this is not a book written purely for those of a

religious persuasion. It's about a small charity working against a tide of negative influences to bring hope and guidance to young people in dire situations. There are both successes and disappointments.

Educación Plus has an enduring connection with Highworth as the original leaders and members of Highworth Community Church were fundamental in its conception. The Holders were members of that church and were originally 'sent out' to Latin America by them.

Why and How to Claim Pension Credit

There's been a lot in the news lately about Pension Credit. The government has announced the end of the Winter Fuel Payment for most of the nearly 13 million drawing the State Pension. From now on, the Winter Fuel Allowance will go only to those pensioners who get Pension Credit to top up their low income.

The government says around 1.3 million households in England and Wales already get Pension Credit and will continue to receive the Winter Fuel Payment, but they estimate that a further 880,000 households would still receive the Winter Fuel Payment if they claimed the Pension Credit they are entitled to. Pension Credit can also help you get other government support with council tax, housing, mortgage interest, TV licence and help with dental treatment, glasses and transport to hospital appointments.

I've estimated from national figures that there are more than 100 pensioner households in Highworth who could retain their Winter Fuel Allowance if only they would apply for Pension Credit, which is quite a lot of Highworth pensioners.

It's not particularly complicated to apply and the amount you could receive makes it worth the effort. But, as ever with government things, the devil sometimes lurks in the details, such as any savings and investments. But you won't know unless you apply.

You can apply for Pension Credit (and the State Pension) up to four months before you reach State Pension age and you can apply any time after you reach State Pension age, but your application can only be backdated by three months.

There are three ways to apply:

- Online
- By phone
- On a paper form

You'll need the following information about you and your partner if you have one:

- National Insurance number
- Information about any income, savings and investments you have
- Your bank account details

If you're confident with the internet, then **online** is the way to go. Go to the website: gov.uk/pension-credit/how-to-claim.

The Bridge Centre on Sheep Street has four computers that you can access, along with someone to guide you. They will be available **Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, 9am to 11am.** You'll need to phone 01793 765060 or drop in to book an appointment. There are also computers in Highworth Library.

The Pension Credit **claim line** is a free number: 0800 991234. It should be pretty quick. When I tested this service in late September I got through to a real person (no, not a machine!) within a minute.

Or you can call the claim line 0800 991234 to request a **form**. Any backdating will start from the date of your call.

Fill it in and post it to 'Freepost DWP Pensions Service 3'. Do not write anything except the freepost address on the envelope. You do not need a postcode or a stamp.

There are **voluntary organisations** which can guide you through the process and also explain other entitlements either on top of or instead of Pension Credit, such as council tax reductions, Attendance Allowance and housing costs. All these organiations have free helplines:

The national news has made much of the withdrawal of the Winter Fuel Allowance for the majority of pensioners. At the same time there are a huge number of people who would still be able to receive it if only they



claimed Pension Credit (apparently, four out of ten who could receive it. don't).

Pension Credit tops up your income to a minimum level and can also give you a host of other benefits. It's a benefit for people who have reached State Pension age. And making a claim is simple. All it takes is a free online or postal application, or telephone call.

Call 080 099 1234 or visit www.gov.uk/pension-credit/how-to-claim. If you find applications difficult, our friendly team of volunteers are happy to help you. We also have leaflets that clearly explain who can get Pension

Credit, how much they can receive, and what other benefits could be gained.

Check in with your circle



Moving Towards Greener Homes

On Tuesday 17 September the Highworth Climate Group was joined by Kate Silvester for a talk entitled 'Save Energy, Save Money'. For 45 minutes we were guided through the process Kate went through to transform her cold and energy inefficient home into a modern green home that is warm, well-ventilated and energy efficient.

This ranged from a simple change to lighting and appliances, draught proofing, switching energy provider and optimising heating system, to more moderate changes such as improving ventilation, improving insulation and the installation of heat pumps. More complicated changes involved a new ventilation system, the installation of solar panels and the purchasing of shares in a wind turbine.

Kate referenced the agencies and organisations who supported her, including Ripple Energy, and Wiltshire Climate Alliance.

Weigh It Up has been a feature on the corner of Highworth's High Street since Matthew and Michelle Aherne took on what used to be the Betfred premises. Over the course of two months (with the help of family and friends) they transformed the space into Highworth's first refill shop.

After Matthew left the RAF, the couple made the decision to open their small business with a view to "doing something different". Matthew has since been running the shop single-handedly with Michelle helping out whenever she had time away from her work commitments

Matthew said, "The shop has steadily become more popular with locals and people from further afield. We have reached the point where our ever-increasing product range has outgrown our current premises and so we were over the moon when the opportunity arose to take on the old TT Linnets building."

Michelle is making a big move by leaving her 25-year career in documentary-making and joining Matthew in expanding the business. She explained, "We will be extending and adjusting our product range, offering

cake and organic coffee. We will take things slowly and respond to what our customers want."

The Ahernes want to encourage people to use reusable options where possible and will be






Update from Big Highworth Community Foundation

60 years of the Highworth Flower Club was celebrated with sparkling floral displays in a storybook wonderland in St. Michael's Church in September.



Highworth Methodist Church – Our Diamond Anniversary

History

It was in 1831 that a group of missionaries first visited Highworth. What we know is that by 1838 a Methodist Chapel had been built. In 1842, a second chapel was built on the Lechlade Road. God was clearly at work! By 1850 the first little

Church being built 1964

chapel was bursting at the seams so it was knocked it down and a new chapel built in the Elms in 1856.

Worship continued for over 100 years two communities witnessing to God's love through Jesus one meeting in what is now the Silver Band Hall on Lechlade Road, the other in what was the Silver Threads Hall in the Elms (now a private residence).

Change in the air....

By the late 1950s Highworth was beginning to grow from its then population of 2,000 people. The Elms Chapel was proving too small for the number of people attending, and the congregations from the two Churches met to plan and prepare for a new building together. This was a huge step of faith and commitment. God blessed the people and a new Methodist Church was built on the present site, which had been the 'Welcome Home Field' for soldiers

returning from the war.

Even this building has since proved too small, as we had a major redevelopment and extension in 1992.

November, when we hope that lots of people who worshipped with us during the last 60 years will come and also many present day Highworth folk will join us too. The Sunday service will be at 10:30am and Rev Paul and Mrs Carmel Ashby are returning to lead our praise and worship as we celebrate 193 years since the missionaries first came, but 60 years since the present building was dedicated to the glory of God.

The wide reproduction of paintings by Georges Seurat and Vincent van Gogh has led to a sense of familiarity and, potentially, a diminished desire to look closely at the real art itself. Yet when van Gogh visited Seurat's studio, he remarked upon the "fresh revelation of colour" in Seurat's work. This presentation aims to rejuvenate our interest in looking slowly with a curious eye to discover how works by both artists were both extraordinary and pioneering. Despite their short artistic careers, both Vincent van Gogh and Georges Seurat made extraordinary contributions to the development of modern art, each through their own distinctive and experimental approaches to picture making.

Since completing an MA at University College London (UCL) in the History of Art: Modernism and the Politics of Representation (1997), Joanna Rhymer has been employed in various roles at the National Gallery including Adult Learning Officer and the Head of Adult Learning Programmes. She is currently a Panel Tutor for the Institute of Continuing Education at the University of Cambridge and teaches for the Wallace Collection and the V&A as well as a range of private institutions.

Getting connected to the Internet can happen in several different ways. **Would YOU like**

Q: How do I find out what my current connection speed is?

A: There is a wide spread of available services across Highworth and surrounding villages. Knowing what you have now is an important first step. You can use the QR code or go to www.speedtest.net and click "Go" to run a line test that within seconds gives you your current connection speed. Make a note



Q: Why do I need faster Internet?

A: You may just be using your internet connection for sending email, checking websites for services and perhaps connecting your Alexa so it will play songs in the kitchen.

For many, their internet connection has become a vital utility which enables them to do their job, access an almost infinite library of entertainment or connect with loved ones over a video call. All of this requires a good internet connection with a growing demand for services.

What you need to do TODAY!

If you want faster internet today or simply have the option for "tomorrow", please 'Register an Interest' on the Openreach website at www.openreach.com/fibrechecker/express-my-interestunavailable



Terms Explained:

Standard Broadband: With speeds of 1mb to 20mb, this technology is over 20 years old and uses your existing copper phone line from the exchange.

ISSUE: You may struggle to stream from services like Netflix or Amazon and 4k TV is not possible.

Fibre Internet: With speeds 24mb to 76mb "Fibre to cabinet", it uses you regular copper phone line though has a fibre optic cable running to the green phone cabinet in the road.

ISSUE: If more than one person is wanting to use the internet connection at once, services like Netflix may suffer and uploading/downloading content will still be slow.

Full Fibre Internet: With speeds of 150mb to 900mb, this is the most modern connection now being rolled out in Highworth. Only ~22% of Highworth has this option available to them.

ISSUE: The majority of Highworth does not have this as an option and Openreach are gauging interest before committing to upgrading available services for everyone.

Do you have an internet connection speed that is less than 10mb? (roughly 18% in Highworth do, so you're not alone)

While you may feel left behind, there is support for eligible residents who currently receiving less than 10Mbs has the right to request better speeds via the Universal Service Obligation (USO). BT is the designated Universal Service Provider and can offer either 4G or broadband to improve speeds. Residents can check if they are eligible and what could be offered via www.bt.com/USO






