

Rotary Awards £250 Grant to Student

Jessica Pryor is a Year 11 student at the Deanery Academy in Swindon who is going to Zanzibar next July on a Global Action programme. She needs to raise the total cost of the trip which is £3,750, and she is pictured here with our Club President Terry Williams (Highworth).

Jessica told us that not only has she been the head student at the Deanery, but she has also contributed to various school events, including the *Festival of Tomorrow*, and she has completed several challenges

and awards such as the Faraday Challenge, Young Leaders award, Duke of Edinburgh bronze, and Brightside STEM mentoring.

The Global Action programmes offer students diverse learning opportunities in marine conservation, terrestrial conservation and alternative livelihoods, focusing on sustainable management, natural resource protection and poverty reduction through sustainable resources. Jessica said, "I'm really looking forward to being pushed out of my comfort zone!"

The tropical island of Zanzibar, off the coast of Tanzania, is known for its unique ecosystem and alternative ways of life. Its spectacular coral reefs, sandy beaches and coastal forests support many endemic and critically endangered species, so it offers a unique opportunity to learn about conservation and biodiversity.

During the 15-day trip, Jessica will snorkel in coral reefs, conduct observational surveys, learn about critically endangered animals like the Red Colobus Monkey, work alongside female seaweed farmers, and explore sustainable solutions.

Southfield Pupils Set Sail



Children at Southfield have made a fantastic start to the new school year with an exciting whole-school project themed around A Moment in Time

The journey began in 1912 as to history to explore what life

pupils stepped back into history to explore what life was like more than a century ago. Pupils then embarked

on a clue hunt, piecing together information to uncover the major historical event they would be studying – the story of the Titanic. This hands-on approach sparked curiosity and excitement, setting the



scene for a term of rich and memorable learning.

As part of their studies, children have investigated the Titanic's route, explored who was travelling on board

and learned about the different class systems that shaped passengers' experiences. They concluded by reflecting on the events of that fateful night when the Titanic struck an iceberg and sank.

The project has not only deepened pupils' historical knowledge but also inspired them to extend their learning beyond the classroom. Many have gone home eager to create their own non-chronological reports, while others have constructed impressive Lego models

of the ship – some so enormous they rival classroom displays!

Teachers at Southfield have been delighted with the enthusiasm and creativity shown by pupils. The A Moment in Time project has truly

brought history to life, capturing imaginations and setting a positive, inspiring tone for the year ahead.

Following our AGM on Monday 17 November, 7pm for 7:30pm, we will hear a talk, *Cotswolds Cornucopia*, by Sean Callery.
















The centre has a dedicated studio which is used by visiting artists who demonstrate their work and engage with the public. There is also a large well-equipped studio for general use and courses for the

Highworth Through History



Do you know that in the Doomsday Book Highworth was called Wrde?

In our school History lessons we are learning about the Normans and how, when William the Conqueror became king, he decided to create the Doomsday Book to record what people owned, who was in their family and what job they had. The Doomsday Book is similar to the Census we now have.

In 1206, King John granted Highworth the right to hold a charter market every Saturday, and by the 17th Century it had become the most important livestock market in all of Wiltshire.

Have you heard of the English Civil War? It was a war in the Stuart era between the Cavillers and the Roundheads. King Charles I was in charge of the Cavillers who were royalists and Oliver Cromwell was in charge of the puritan Roundheads who were parliamentarians. St. Michael's Church in Highworth has a hole in the outside wall caused by the Roundheads when they invaded Highworth. The canon ball is on display inside the church!

Highworth was one of the rural areas which benefitted from the dawning of the Industrial Revolution. The Victorian Industrial Revolution saw steam-powered engines created, so then machines were invented to make manufacturing easier. Areas in the countryside became the big cities we see today, making them more popular. At one time, Highworth was bigger than Swindon!

I hope you have an amazing November, and I'll see you next month!




