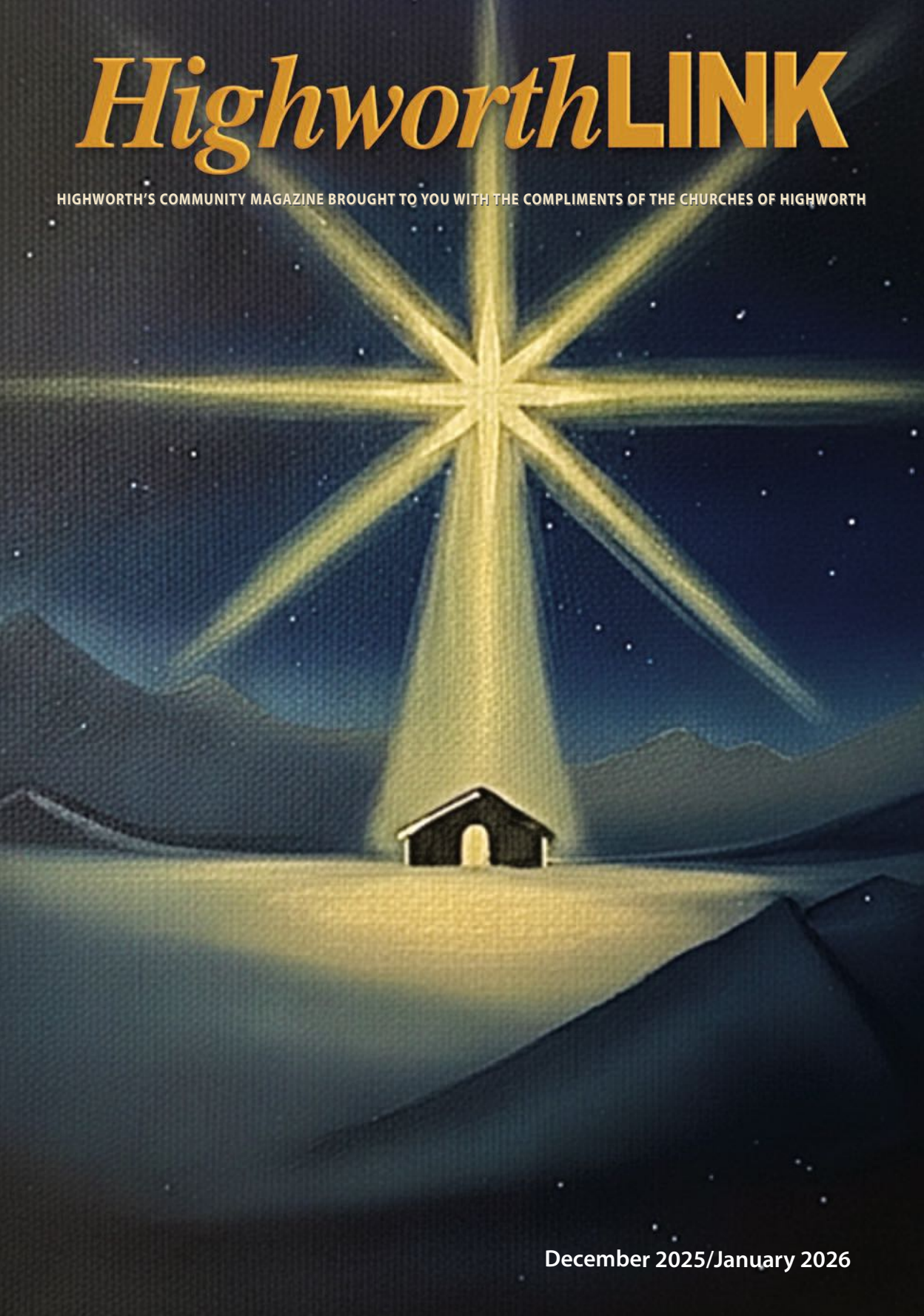

What Do You Really Need to Celebrate Christmas?

Over the centuries, countless traditions have shaped the way we celebrate Christmas. Our Victorian forebears were especially influential in popularising many of the customs we now take for granted – the Christmas tree, festive decorations, and even the beloved Christmas turkey. From Santa Claus to stockings, the season has become rich with symbols of warmth and joy.

Several years ago, I spent four months living at a theological college in South India. My time there included the seasons of Advent and Christmas, offering me the chance to experience the celebrations of a Christian minority within a largely non-Christian culture. Christian households would often keep a lighted lantern in their windows during Advent as a symbol of the coming of the Light of the World. During church services, local prayers and worship songs filled the air, though occasionally we found ourselves singing traditional Western carols about snow and



winter, despite the temperature outside being a balmy 25 degrees!

That experience reminded me that Christmas isn't truly about the trimmings – not the tree, the pudding, or the wintry scenes – but about the message they point to. At its heart, Christmas celebrates love, generosity and hope. People express that spirit in many ways: sharing food, giving gifts, decorating homes, and gathering for worship. Whether it's lanterns glowing in India, or candles flickering in Europe, the meaning remains the same: light shining in the darkness.

So, what do we really need to celebrate Christmas? Not much, really. A thankful heart and a willingness to share the good news of God's love for the world. Wherever we are in the world, Christmas reminds us that love can bridge every distance and brighten every place.

Firewalk Fundraiser for Society Without Abuse

Fearless fundraisers from across Swindon have raised over £14,000 for local domestic abuse charity Society Without Abuse (SWA) by braving the blaze in the SWA Firewalk.

Swindon Cricket Club was alight with bravery and enthusiasm as participants first walked over broken glass before embracing the embers, raising £14,008.08 so far, with money continuing to come in. The majority of money raised was match-funded by the Big Give's Women and Girls Fund, meaning that the money will be used directly for SWA's recovery programmes for adult and child victims of domestic abuse.

Cheered on by friends and family, 30 brave walkers took on the challenge of walking 15 feet over red-hot coals – a symbolic journey mirroring the experience of many survivors of domestic abuse: beginning with fear and

uncertainty, building courage step by step, and finally achieving something once thought impossible.

The event was made possible thanks to sponsorship from Gel Studios and the generosity and support of the Swindon Cricket Club and their

members. Local food vendors Gourmet58, Samosas2go and the Sugar Shack kept walkers and supporters fuelled through the evening.

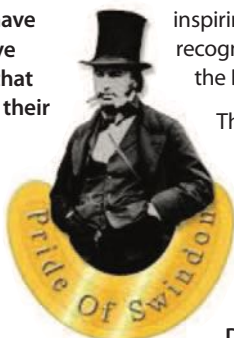
Pride of Swindon Awards Are Open

CAP Expanding to Meet Increasing Demand

The team at Highworth's Christians Against Poverty (CAP) Debt Centre, based at The Bridge Centre, is expanding to help people as costs remain high. The Debt Centre team has appointed Deb Wathen as an additional Debt Coach, doubling the number of appointments available to local people.

Since opening in 2014, the centre has seen steady growth in the number of people seeking help with their financial issues.

Kathryn Ford, CAP Debt Centre Manager, said, "Since we started, it has been wonderful to be able to help so many families and individuals go debt-free in Highworth. They can now move forward with their

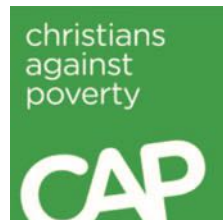
lives without the constant stress, worry and anxiety that often comes with being in debt.

"Over the years, we've seen the need for free debt help grow, and we want to be able to help as many people as we possibly can. Now, with the addition of Deb to the team, it's great to be able to offer more support for local people."

Deb said, "I love the Highworth area and its people. I want to give something back, and the CAP Debt Centre gives me a chance to do that. I can work with people and walk with them as they see real change and a way out of debt. I know how difficult managing finances can be for us all, particularly at the minute with high prices, and especially if someone is also struggling with other challenges like ill-health, bereavement or unemployment."

New Drop-in Café for Community Larder

The Highworth Community Larder (HCL) drop-in café – Welcome Wednesday – opened in September.

Visitors were able to enjoy a free cup of coffee or tea with cake or biscuits, as well as good company in a warm and welcoming venue.

This opening session was attended by Julie Murphy, Mayor of Highworth. We are very grateful to Highworth Town Council (HTC) for their generosity in letting us use the Council Rooms and to the two volunteers from Hilliers who came to help. We were also visited by a reporter from BBC Wiltshire, Karen Gardener, who interviewed one of the trustees, Alison Durrant, and wrote a very supportive article about the café which you can read by going to www.bbc.co.uk/news/articles/c62lgvxp5jxo.

Representatives from Citizens Advice attended our October session. They were able to help a number of people with advice and this was much appreciated by our customers. We hope they will visit us again and that other agencies will also attend to offer information or advice.

The café will be held in the Council Rooms in Gilberts Lane on the **third Wednesday of each month** from 9:30am to 11am. Advance notice of these sessions can be found on the HCL and HTC social media pages. We look forward to welcoming you.

Alongside this new venture we continue to run the Community Larder **every Tuesday**, from 8am to 10am, at Westrop School where we distribute surplus food received from supermarkets and other donors to our visitors free of charge.

To accomplish all this we are reliant on our wonderful team of volunteers, who staff the café and the larder and also collect surplus food from supermarkets. Sadly people do sometimes have to leave us, and we are always looking for new volunteers. National Trust Buscot and Coleshill

This month, it's all about how we're working with partners.

In September we were more than grateful to welcome the Scouts who picked loads of apples for Highworth Community Cider. We are looking forward to trying some of this year's batch!

As winter draws in, there is still plenty to be done in the countryside for nature conservation. At Wayland Smithy, we are working in partnership with National Trails who are working with the Ridgeway Partnership. Our Area Ranger, Andy Foley, recently worked with them and a group of volunteers to create dead hedging

to make way for tree planting through the winter.

Progress is also being made in the flood management of Buscot. Training has been provided by RM Wetlands and Environmental to our valued partner organisations – Berks, Bucks and Oxon Wildlife Trust, Cotswold Rivers Trust, as well as staff and volunteers. The session was designed to show how we can install leaky dams. These dams are nature-based solutions made from logs and branches. The aim is to install them in ditches south of the village to reduce the impact of flooding. Check back in the months ahead for updates as work begins.

We partnered with Petra National Trust in Jordan this year as part of the Withstanding Change Project. The teams in Coleshill and Jordan connected online and in person, and this has helped both locations progress towards the same goal: helping young people consider careers in heritage and sustainable futures nationally and locally in both countries. The partnership has only just begun, and there are many plans for the future.

The evening marked the launch of the South East Asia Health Policy Network, bringing together over 50 policymakers, health professionals and advocates to address the health impacts of climate change.

Founders Jamie and Zobel Starritt shared grassroots Filipino perspectives, highlighting the resilience and innovation of communities in a nation continually struck by calamities and natural disasters. As a small charity, Heart for Philippines takes pride in its swift action – delivering life-saving aid within 24 hours of a disaster.

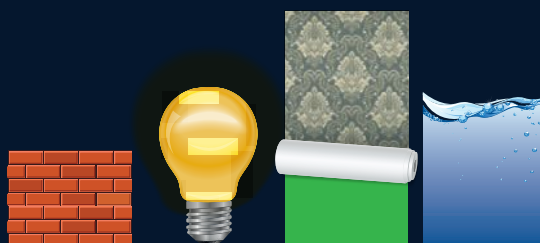

Many see it as the cornerstone of community, providing news and information and, therefore, deepening a sense of togetherness. Recognising how vital LINK Magazine is to the community, for two or three years now the churches of Highworth have been considering its future. Like so many groups and organisations, Covid hit the magazine hard and changed our perspective about how

Southfield Students Explore Tales of the Nile and Migration



Years 3 and 4 children at Southfield Junior School have been studying an exciting Ancient Egyptian topic that has taken them back over 5,000 years in history.

By placing Ancient Egypt on a timeline, children have been figuring out exactly when this amazing civilization existed compared to other times they have studied. Using modern maps, they've also discovered where Egypt is in the world today and explored why the River Nile was so important for farming and daily life. It would seem that, without the Nile, Ancient Egypt might have been a very different place and not nearly as exciting!

In History lessons, the children have been learning all about the clothes people wore, the jobs they did, and even the games they played in Ancient Egypt. They've met the Pharaohs, are learning about thousands of gods and goddesses, and discovering what Ancient Egyptians believed about the afterlife. They are now beginning to realise there is more to Egyptian life than just pyramids!

In English, the children got stuck in with writing their own versions of the Cinderella story set in Ancient

Egypt, weaving in everything they've learned about Egyptian culture, clothing and gods. It's cleverly combining history with storytelling, and the children are truly turning into mini-Egyptologists and authors at the same time.

Art lessons have been buzzing with creativity too! The children have been experimenting with mixed media

to create interesting textured backgrounds and delved into Ancient Egyptian art and symbols, including the mysterious hieroglyphs. They've found out these symbols weren't just pretty pictures but were believed to have magical powers. Taking it a step further, the children even tried their hand at making papyrus paper from scratch, just like the Egyptians did thousands of



years ago. They topped off their creativity by designing and crafting their own Egyptian scrolls, decorating them with hieroglyphs and symbols.

This fascinating and fun topic is giving the children a solid understanding of one of the world's oldest and most captivating civilizations whilst sharpening their skills in history, geography, art and writing. With this strong start, they're all set to explore even more ancient worlds – and maybe one day discover some new stories of their own!

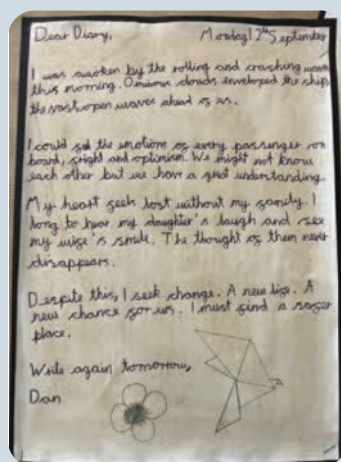
This term, our Year 5/6 students have begun exploring the topic of migration using Shaun Tan's beautifully illustrated graphic novel, *The Arrival*, as a stimulus.

Over the past few weeks, we have looked at why people migrate, focusing on key ideas such as push and pull factors, emigration and reasons why people move to Britain. The children have engaged with the topic in a creative and thoughtful way, producing tea-stained diary entries written from the perspective of a migrant, capturing the emotions and experiences of starting a new life in an unfamiliar place.

They also created delicate origami birds, inspired by the imagery in *The Arrival*, to represent themes of hope and journey.

After half term, we'll be continuing our work by learning about the Commonwealth and how it connects to migration throughout history.

Georgia Brown's football journey began on the pitches of Highworth where she played from 2008 to 2011, aged between six and nine.

After Highworth, Georgia joined Swindon Town FC Community Foundation, where she played until age 16. Her time there included appearances in prestigious youth tournaments like the Barcelona and Dallas Cups. With Swindon lacking weekend fixtures, she also represented Swindon Spitfires, Abbey Meads, and Crowmarsh FC to keep her competitive edge sharp.

A former Eastrop, Southfields and Warneford school pupil, Georgia completed sixth form at Oxford High School for girls, playing football throughout her education. At 15 she trialled for Oxford United women's team and was signed, gaining senior experience on loan at Cheltenham Town in the fourth tier of women's football. She returned to Oxford United and played until 2021.

Her talent earned her a call-up to the Scotland under-19 squad where she played against Spain and Belgium. She was set to compete in the under-19 European

Championships in 2020 but the tournament was cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Later in 2021 Georgia crossed the Atlantic to attend New York's Hofstra University, an NCAA Division 1

school, and was named Conference Rookie of the Season helping her team win the Conference Championship. In her final year she was named 'Female Student Athlete of the Year' for both university and conference, graduating with a 4.0 honours degree in biomedical science.

June 2025 marked another milestone for Georgia as she was called up to Scotland's Under-23 squad and played two matches against Iceland. A month later she signed with Sporting Jax, a new professional team in Jacksonville, Florida to compete in the Gainbridge Super League. This was followed by a spate with the Scottish women's national team.

Georgia's story is one of perseverance, adaptability and excellence, both on the pitch and in the classroom. From local pitches in Wiltshire to international arenas, she's a shining example of what passion and hard work can achieve.

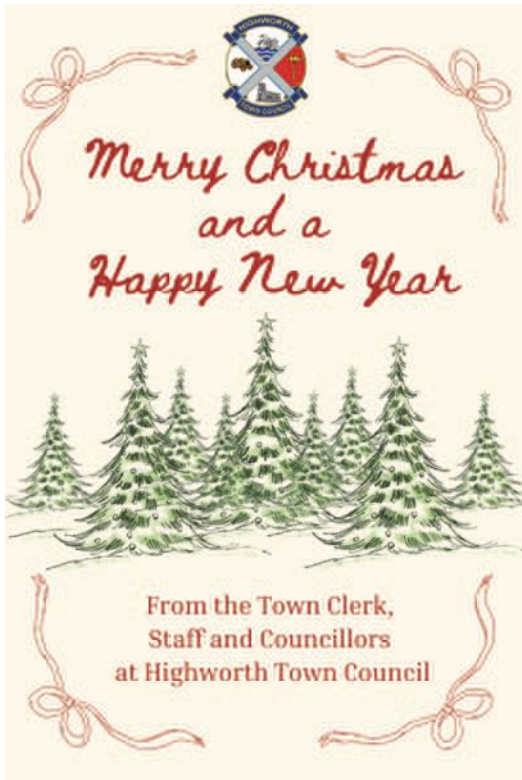

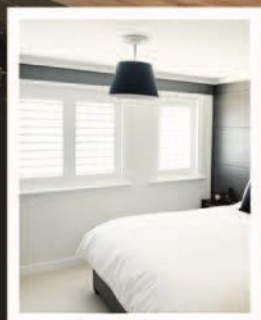
